ED finds Rs 2.54 crore in washing machine

The Enforcement Directorate stumbled upon Rs 2.54 crore hidden in one of the most unlikely places, inside a washing machine, during searches it conducted under the provisions of the Foreign Exchange Management Act across Hyderabad, Delhi, Mumbai,

Revanth will join BJP after LS polls: KTR

Says the CM has already started preparations

BRS working president KT Rama Rao on Tuesday said Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy was fostering plans to join the BJP after the Lok Sabha elections.

Contrary to accusations made by the Congress central leadership against Prime Minister Narendra Modi, he pointed out that Revanth Reddy was toeing the BJP line by terming Modi as his 'Bade Bhai' (elder brother) and appreciating the 'Gujarat' model.

Addressing a gathering of BRS MPs, MLAs, MLCs, corporators and senior party leaders at Telangana Bhavan here, Rama Rao termed Revanth Reddy as the first Congress leader to defect to the BJP, for which he had already started preparations. He challenged Revanth Reddy's silence on the allegations of his defection to the BJP, and failure to declare publicly that he would serve the Congress throughout his lifetime.

He alleged that the Chief Minister was trying to divert public attention from the ongoing sand mining scams, and blackmailing of rice millers, realtors and other businessmen for bribes, by sensationalising

false accusations of scams under the BRS regime. He stated that the permissions for construction projects had not been cleared for the past three months, without paying kickbacks to the rul-

ing party.

Revanth changes tone, attacks Modi

After facing a severe backlash from different sections for calling Prime Minister Narendra Modi his big brother, Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy switched gears on Tuesday, attacking Modi over his contribution to Telangana's development. The Chief Minister al-

leged that the Prime Minister had failed in completing the Pranahita Chevella irrigation project. He sanctioned a bullet train to Gujarat but did not approve an MMTS train to Vikarabad. The Sabarmati River Front was developed in Gujarat but funds were not sanctioned for River Musi Front development, the Chief Minister said while addressing party leaders at the Chevella parliament constituency meeting here. the case against her is not a money laundering case but one of 'political laundering'. She exuded confidence that she would come out clean, adding that she has complete faith in the judiciary in this regard.

Kavitha, who is currently in the custody of the ED in connection with the Delhi excise policy case, was produced before the Rouse Avenue Court at the end of her custody. Later, she was taken to Tihar Jail, prison officials said, after the court sent her to judicial custody till April 9. "She has reached Tihar Jail and will be lodged in jail number 6, which is the women's jail. Her medical examination will be conducted," an official said.

Earlier in the day, before entering the court, the BRS legislator spoke to the media and said that the case against her was fabricated and false. Kavitha attacked



the BJP stating that she might be lodged in jail temporarily but her self-esteem cannot be shattered. She reiterated that there is no question of her turning into an approver. "This is not a money laundering case but a political laundering case. One accused has joined BJP, the second accused is getting a BJP ticket and the third accused has given Rs 50 crore to BJP in electoral bonds. I will come out clean like a pearl," she declared. Kavitha was arrested on March 15 by the ED from her residence in Hyderabad.

Australia tightens student visa rules

daunting challenge lies ahead for Indian students, especially from the two speaking States, dreaming of pursuing higher education and gainful employment in Australia. After Canada and the UK, it is now the turn of Australia to tighten student visa rules, as the country witnesses a heavy influx of international stu-

From revising the English proficiency scores to rolling out a new 'Genuine Student Test', the Australian government has come out with new rules



to allow students into the country only with genuine academic pursuit. These new rules have come into effect from March 23, 2024. International students seeking Temporary

Graduate Visa (TGV) will now have to secure a minimum of 6.5 band score or equivalent in the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) as against the previous 6

rules, the applicant has to score a minimum of 5.5 in each component, including reading, writing, speaking and listening in IELTS.

lidity has been reduced from three years to one year, which means the applicants must submit evidence that they appeared for the English language test within one year before the date of visa application. The TGV granted for two to four years allows international graduates to live, study and work after completion of the course.
