# Govt to insist on affidavit for tenant farmers

#### D CHANDRA BHASKAR RAO HYDERABAD

The State government's move to insist on an affidavit in support of the land let out by pattedars to tenant farmers for extending crop in-vestment support to the latter is raising serious concerns. It is feared that the affidavit-based consideration for benefits under Rythu Bharosa, the Congress-tweaked version of the highly successful Rythu Bandhu, could build a conflict between landowners and tenant farmers.

As a consequence of this, the tenants could find themselves at the receiving end. A State-wide exercise is expected to be taken up to identify tenant farmers soon. Their number could be anywhere between 17 lakh to 22 lakh in Telangana, as it varies by crop season. It is an acknowledged fact that almost every third farmer is a tenant farmer in the State.

There is no blueprint finalised yet to categorise who the tenant farmer is and who would merit the crop investment support in the
