The animal mortality has risen from Thursday's toll of 31 and comprises three rhinos, 62 hog deer and an otter due to drowning. PTI

Heavy security deployed; 'Chalo Delhi' planned

Amidst a tight security clampdown, the Telangana Public Service Commission (TGPSC) in Nampally, which resembled a veritable fortress, heavily barricaded by razor-sharp concertina wire and guarded by police personnel, the unemployed youth of Telangana held a

massive protest on Friday. The protestors, demanding the immediate release of a job calendar and fulfilling the poll promises — including increasing Group-II and III vacancies — made during the recent Assembly elections, clashed with the police.
