BRS to expose **Cong hypocrisy** on defections

Explores ways to move SC, approach President & ECI

The Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) has decided to intensify its fight against the Congress, which has been encouraging unlawful defections of MLAs in Telangana. Party working president KT Rama Rao said they would seize every opportunity to expose the hypocrisy and double standards of the Congress at the national level. Accompanied by former

Minister T Harish Rao,

Rama Rao has been in Delhi consulting with legal and constitutional experts, exploring ways to approach the Supreme Court and seek disqualification of defected elected representatives. "We have already submitted our petitions before the Assembly Telangana Speaker and the Telangana High Court seeking disqualification of the defected MLAs. We will take further steps based on the outcome," he said. Speaking to the media in Delhi on Tuesday, Rama Rao revealed

plans to approach President Droupadi Murmu, Vice President and Rajya Sabha chairman Jagdeep Dhankar, Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla and the Election Commission of India in this regard. The party is also mulling over holding a meeting of like-minded political parties

at the Constitution Club to discuss a united approach against defections. The party called on all the victims of the BIP and the Congress to join this collective effort. Stating that the Congress raised curtains for political

defections and introduced the 'Aayaram Gayaram' culture in India, he said it was ironic that the same party had introduced the Anti-Defection Law in 1987 when the Congress itself faced defections. He said the Congress was now encouraging defections in Telangana, violating the same law they once championed.

'The Congress claims to

be the saviour and vanguard of the Constitution. Rahul Gandhi, who often flaunts the Constitution of India before the media and makes a huge cry over its violation by the BJP, is also responsible for its desecration," he said, pointing out the irony of Congress' stance on defections, noting their outcry over defections from their party in Goa, Madhya Pradesh, Haryana and other States, while they themselves were encouraging the practice in Telangana. "Rahul Gandhi made Congress candidates in Goa take oath against defecting to other parties," the BRS

Four Telugus held for human trafficking in US HOUSTON

Four persons of Telugu origin, including a woman, have been charged with allegedly running a human labour trafficking scheme out of a home in the US State of Texas, a media report said. The Princeton Police Department released details of an investigation that led to four people being arrested after 15 women were found inside the home as alleged victims of human labour trafficking, news portal Fox4News.com said on Monday night.

Chandan Dasireddy, 24, Dwaraka Gunda, 31, Santhosh Katkoori, 31, and Anil Male, 37, all arrested in March, are now charged

with trafficking of persons, a second-degree felony, and more arrests are expected, the channel reported, quot-

ing police. The authorities found that all the young women, living in the same home, were forced to sleep on the floor

at a home on Ginsburg Lane in Collin County, Princeton. "There was basically no furniture inside the home at the centre of human trafficking, just a bunch of computer electronics and blankets," police said. Another news portal, McKinney Courier-

Gazette said officers with the Princeton Police Department were dispatched on March 13 to a residence regarding a welfare concern and suspicious circumstance. "After further investigation of the initial report, Princeton Police CID detec-

tives obtained a search warrant for the home of Santhosh Katkoori, where 15 adult females were located. During the investigation, it was discovered that the females were forced to work for Katkoori and multiple programming shell companies owned by him and his wife, Dwaraka Gunda," it

While the search warrant was executed, multiple laptops, cell phones, printers and fraudulent documents were seized. It was later determined that multiple locations within Princeton, Melissa, and McKinney were involved in the forced labouring of the victims, including adult males, the por-
