Riders may rob ryots of waiver

Scheme guidelines come with tough conditions

STATE BUREAU HYDERABAD

The Congress government has once again revealed its true colours by imposing multiple riders for farmers if they want to avail the much-awaited crop loan waiver, for which guidelines were issued on Monday.

Right from the amount that would be waived to the eligibility criteria that a farmer has to meet to become a beneficiary, all come with a tough set of conditions, which were not mentioned by the Congress, Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy in particular, when the promise of the loan waiver was repeatedly made during the recent Assembly and Parliament elec-

tion campaigns.
The conditions have already triggered apprehensions that several farmers could lose out on the waiver, for which they were waiting desperately ever since Revanth Reddy egged them on during his campaign to go and avail loans immediately and that he would waive them off.

Despite the Chief Minister repeatedly assuring farmers that no strict conditions would be imposed, the

State, in the government order (G.O. Rt. No 567) listing out the guidelines, has said the waiver would not be applicable for rescheduled or restructured loans. The waiver would also be limited to Rs 2 lakh per farmer's family, with the principal amount and interest component as on December 9, 2023, also to be considered. At the same time, the food security card (ration card) database of the Civil Supplies Department would be considered as a parameter to determine a farmer's family, including the household head, spouse and children. KTR DEMANDS IMMEDIATE RELEASE OF YOUTH LEADERS

HYDERABAD: BRS working president KT Rama Rao strongly condemned the arrest of the party's student leaders, including Rajaram Yadav, who were fighting in support of the unemployed youth and attempting to lay siege to the State Secretariat on Monday. He demanded their immediate release. He slammed the State government for its harsh treatment to-

wards unemployed youth protesting for their jobs. He said rather than delivering the electoral promises and addressing unemployment, the Congress government had not only abandoned the youth, but was also using police forces to suppress their peaceful protests. He condemned the police misconduct towards student leaders too.

Team (QRT), Commissioner's Task Force and local police, identified the probable protestors and detained them. A few youngsters managed to rush tobuilding and sat on the road.

The police picked them up and shifted them into police vehicles. All of them were shifted to different police stations and the Goshamahal police stadium. A few of the leaders were shifted to the Falaknuma police sta-

tion in the far end of the city. Since morning, the police had set up barricades on the roads leading to the State Secretariat and lathi-wielding personnel were guarding traffic junctions.

Trump told the paper he wanted to keep speaking following the shooting but the Secret Service insisted he go to the hospital. "I just wanted to keep speaking, but I just got shot," he said. Trump also said he appreciated the call he received from President Joe Biden, according to the *Post*, calling it "fine" and "very nice". PTI

Revanth faces toddy tappers' ire

Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy's comments while 'interacting' with toddy toppers on Sunday triggered an instant backlash from various quarters, especially from toddy tappers and the Goud community.

The Chief Minister's comments came during the launch of the distribution of the 'Katamayya Raksha Kavacham' safety equip-ment scheme for toddy tappers at Abdullapurmet in Ranga Reddy on Sunday. During the programme,

some toddy tappers were made to climb trees much ahead of the Chief Minister's arrival and after being made to wait till he, along

D Sridhar Babu, Ponnam Prabhakar and Damodara Raja Narasimha, reached the venue. The Chief Minister's mode of 'interaction' was the first to draw flak, with videos showing the toddy tappers dangling from palm trees even as he, comfortably seated on a dais, went on talking to them using a microphone.

In the videos, which have gone viral, the Chief Minister is seen asking them how much toddy each tapper would get a day. In reply, a toddy tapper is heard saying that from 15 trees, about 40-45 litres of toddy was collected. Responding to this, Revanth Reddy asked how much water was mixed in the toddy.

Man stuck in lift for 2 days rescued

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM

A 59-year-old man was stuck in the lift of the busy Government Medical College Hospital here for the past two days and was rescued on Monday morning by an operator, who had arrived for routine work, police said.

The ordeal of Ulloor resident Ravindran Nair, a patient who came for a medical checkup, began on Saturday when he stepped into the lift, which malfunctioned and trapped him inside. He was later admitted to the hospital for related health issues.

incident prompted the government to initiate disciplinary action against the officials responsible for the lapse. On Sunday night, the man's family filed a 'missing per-

son' case with the Medical College police. According to the police, Nair entered the lift to go to the first floor, but it malfunctioned and failed to open, leaving him trapped and unable to exit. His cries for help went unheeded and his phone battery died and left him unable to call for assistance, they said.

State Health Minister Veena George has ordered an investigation into the incident and sought a report. The Health Department has also suspended three staff members — two lift operators and a duty sergeant. The man said he had been sure that someone would come and operate the lift at least on Monday. Nair's son, Hari Shankar, said his father was pretty shaken up as he had been inside the lift for almost two days. PTI

5 drug peddlers caught; actor among clients

The Cyberabad police, with the assistance of the TG Anti-Narcotics Bureau (TGANB), arrested five drug peddlers and 13 customers, including Hindi actor Aman Preet Singh.

The Cyberabad police, on Monday, said they seized 200 g of cocaine valued at Rs 35 lakh, two passports, two bikes and 10 cell phones from the peddlers. "Among the customers identified are Aman Preeth Singh and 12 others. Six of them were apprehended and they had tested positive for use of cocaine. During the probe, if we get to know that the customers sold drugs, they will be treated as peddlers," DCP (Shamshabad) Ch Srinivas
