Crop loan waiver launched; **BRS** says funds diverted

Loans up to Rs 1 lakh to be waived by depositing Rs 6,098 cr in 11.5 L ryots' a/cs

STATE BUREAU HYDERABAD

Still under a shadow of uncertainty on how many farmers would actually benefit from it, the muchawaited crop loan waiver scheme was launched here on Thursday.

Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy, formally launching the scheme, said the previous government, during its 10-year tenure, had waived Rs 21,000 crore and that the latest version of the scheme would see crop loans up to Rs 1 lakh being waived by depositing Rs 6,098 crore into the bank accounts of 11.5 lakh farmers in the first phase.

Under the second phase, loans of up to Rs l.5 lakh would be waived, for which about Rs 8,000 crore was required. Similarly, in the third phase, loans of Rs

2 lakh would be waived before August-end, for which Rs 15,000 crore would be required, the Chief Minister said.

Alleging that the BRS government had failed to fulfil the promise made to farmers on the crop loan waiver, he claimed that the Congress government, within seven

months, had fulfilled the promise made to farmers "without imposing any terms and conditions".

Addressing farmers at different Rythu Vedikas via video conference from the Secretariat, Revanth Reddy said the passbook was the only parameter for the crop loan waiver and not the ration card,

which would be used to determine a farmer's family". Stressing that the

Congress government was committed to the welfare of the people, the Chief Minister said in the last seven months, Rs 29,000 crore was spent on welfare schemes. "We are paying salaries to the employees on the first of every month. Rs 5,000 crore is being released towards pensions and salaries," he said.

While interacting with a farmer from Warangal, the Chief Minister said it was from the same place where the Congress had announced the Rythu Declaration. Accordingly, a public meeting will be conducted this month to thank the AICC leadership.

Rythu Bandhu disbursal affected, says KTR

The Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) on Thursday called out the deceit of the Congress government, pointing out that in the guise of implementing the crop loan waiver, the Congress was taking farmers for a ride. The government had

diverted Rs 7,000 crore, meant for the disbursal of the Rythu Bandhu farm input assistance for this season, to the crop

loan waiver scheme, it said. Pointing out the government's silence on the Rythu Bandhu assistance, BRS working president KT Rama Rao said the Congress government was yet again deceiving the farmers. Under Rythu Bandhu, the Congress government had to extend Rs 7,000-crore assistance to farmers in June, but these funds were diverted for the implementation of the

crop loan waiver, he said. Over 40 lakh farmers had secured loans up to Rs 1 lakh but the Congress government was waiving the loans of only 11 lakh farmers. More so, the crop loan waiver being offered by the Congress government was meagre compared to the waiver done under the KCR government in 2014 and 2018, he

Giving details, he said in 2014, the then KCR government had waived loans up to Rs 1 lakh secured by 35 lakh farmers by spending about

Rs 16,144 crore. Again in 2018, loans of 37 lakh farmers were waived by spending about Rs 19,198 crore, he posted on X. "As promised in its manifesto, the Congress government should waive all loans up to Rs 2 lakh. These apart,

all eligible farmers should be ex-

The Supreme Court on Thursday directed the National Testing Agency (NTA) to declare by 12 noon of July 20 the centreand city-wise results of controversy-ridden NEET-UG 2024 while masking the identities of the aspirants, saying it wanted to ascertain whether candidates appearing at allegedly tainted centres scored more than those elsewhere.

As it strove to address the allegations of malpractices in the conduct of the May 5 examination, a Bench headed by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud said any order for conducting it afresh has to be on a concrete conclusion that the alleged leak was "systemic" and the sanctity of the entire process was affected.

"We direct the NTA to publish the marks obtained by students at the UG-2024 NEET examination, while, at the same time, without disclosing the identity of the students. The result should be declared city- and centre-wise by 12 noon on July 20, 2024, and shall be uploaded on the website of the NTA," the Bench, also **CBI arrests 4 AIIMS medicos**

The Telangana High Court on Thursday expressed so rious dissatisfaction with the State's inaction in addressing the problem to tackle the growing issue of street dogs in Hyderabad.

It directed the State government to immediately formulate a comprehensive action plan to tackle the growing issue of street dogs in Hyderabad within a week. The Division Bench, comprising Chief Justice Alok Aradhe and Justice Anil Kumar Jukanti, was dealing with a suo moto PIL taken based on reports of street dogs attacking children and causing among residents.

Initially, the PIL was taken up on a report on a pack of dogs mauling a fouryear-old boy to death in the city. Another tragic event took place on July 16, wherein an 18-month-old toddler was attacked by a pack of street dogs in Adarsh Nagar, Jawaharnagar. The boy suffered severe injuries on his scalp and died despite receiving immediate medical treatment.

Heavy rain, gale to lash Telangana

Multiple districts in Telangana are expected to witness extremely heavy rainfall in the coming days, as the India Meteorological Department (IMD)-Hyderabad has issued red, orange and yellow alerts for various parts of the State till July 21.

A yellow alert has also been issued for Hyderabad indicating moderate showers, along with occasional intense spells, and gusty

On Thursday, the city experienced occasional drizzles and pleasant weather with a maximum temperature of around 29 degrees. However, other parts of the State, including Bhadradri

Kothagudem, Mancherial, Nizamabad, Jagtial, Jayashankar Bhupalpally and Khammam, reported downpours.

Meanwhile, Dammapeta Aswaraopeta in Bhadradri Kothagudem recorded 109.3 mm and 86.8 mm of rainfall, respectively. For Friday, a red alert has

been issued for isolated places in Mulugu, Bhadradri Kothagudem, Khammam and Mahabubabad, indicating extremely heavy rain.

Additionally, an orange alert, signifying very heavy rain, is likely in Kumuram Bheem Asifabad, Mancherial, Karimnagar, Peddapalli, Iayashankar Bhupalpally, Warangal Hanamkonda, according to the India Meteorological
