Budget relies on debts, allocations only for Gruha Jyothi, LPG schemes

The State Budget for 2024-25 has sparked significant concern due to its heavy re-liance on debts. The Congress government on Thursday revealed a total expenditure plan of Rs 2,91,159 crore, with a substantial portion of Rs 69,572.48 crore funding sourced from debt, next only to the State's own tax revenue.

Further, the Budget remains full of promises, with either no or meagre allocations made for different schemes and projects. The Budget outlines that Rs 69,572.48 crore will be raised through various various forms of debt.

This amount equals to half of the State's own tax revenue estimated at Rs 1,38,181.26 crore and highlights the growing dependency on borrowings. Ironically, Deputy Chief Minister and Finance Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka attempted to blame the previ-

ous BRS regime for obtaining loans, saying that this was forcing the current Congress government to allocate most of the funds for repayment. Breaking down the debt further, the Budget indicates that Rs 57.112.48 crore will be from open marfrom the Central government, 1,000 crore from other sources, Rs 4,000 crore from

revenue. Wait and watch deposit transactions, and Rs 3,560 crore from loans and advances. The projected

revenue receipts stand at Rs 2,21,242.23 crore, including Rs 1,38,181.26 crore from tax revenue, 26,216.38 crore from the State's share in Central taxes, Rs 35,208.44 crore from non-tax revenue, and Rs 21,636.15 crore from Central grants.

Of the total Budget, Rs 2,20,944.81 crore has been allocated for revenue expenditure, with Rs 17,729.77 crore set aside for interest on loans. Only Rs 33,486.50 crore, a

mere 11.5 per cent of the total Budget, was allocated for capital expenditure, which includes development of projects. The fiscal deficit stands at Rs 49,255.41 crore, with a minor Budget surplus

of Rs 297.42 crore. Despite Bhatti's assurances of a realistic Budget,

experts argue that the Budget projections were overly optimistic. For instance, the previous year's Budget anticipated Rs 41,259.17 crore in grants from the Centre, but only Rs 9,729.91 crore was realised. This year's Budget forecasts Rs 21,636.15 crore in Central grants. Despite as surance to enhance the financial assistance for beneficiaries under the Indiramma Housing scheme from Rs 3 lakh to Rs 5 lakh, no specific allocation

Govt presents Rs 2.91L cr Budget

HYDERABAD: The State government on Thursday presented its maiden fullscale Budget with an outlay of Rs 2,91,159 crore for the financial year 2024-25.

This is around Rs 15,000 crore more than the Vote on Account Budget of Rs 2.76 lakh crore presented by the government in February earlier this year and marginally higher than the Rs 2.9 lakh crore introduced by the previous BRS government for 2023-24. The State's total estimated revenues

are Rs 2,90,814 crore, which includes Rs 2,21,242.23 crore through revenue receipts. Another Rs 69,572.48 crore is proposed for mobilisation through capital receipts, including over Rs 57.112.48 crore from open market loans. While the revenue expenditure is pegged at Rs 2.20,944.81 crore, the capital expenditure is estimated at Rs 33,486.5 crore.

Presenting the Budget in Assembly, Finance Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka

shot up to Rs 6.71 lakh crore at the end of 2023-24 against Rs 75,577 crore in 2014-15 since State formation. He said the State government was taking all measures to maintain fiscal prudence and put the economy back on track by repaying the majority of the loans with around Rs 17 001 37 crore allocated for loan disbursements as well as Rs 19,626.32 crore towards loans and advances.

Anti-farmer, lacks vision, says KCR

Leader of Opposition and BRS chief K Chandrashekhar Rao dubbed the maiden State Budget introduced by the Congress government as anti-farmer, anti-poor and one lacking vision. States can tax mines, rules SC

NEW DELHI

In a setback to the Centre, the Supreme Court held that royalty payable on minerals is not a tax and States have the legislative competence to impose taxes on mines and minerals-bearing lands.

The verdict will give a boost to mineral-rich states like Jharkhand and Odisha as they urged the top court to decide on recovery of taxes worth thousands of crores rupees levied by the Centre till now. The States urged SC to make the verdict operational with retrospective effect to ensure refund of the taxes from the Centre. However, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for Centre, opposed the submissions and sought that the verdict be made effective prospectively. (SEE PAGE 2)

Four killed as rains batter Pune

Heavy rains wreaked havoc in Maharashtra's Pune, where at least four persons died in rain-related incidents on Thursday, while several houses and residential societies in low-lying areas were inundated, officials said. Deputy Chief Minister

Ajit Pawar said as a precautionary measure, Army teams have been deployed at Ekta Nagar in Sinhagad Road, while NDRF personnel are also in the area. He also said rescue operations are underway at the site of a landslide in Lavasa.

Meanwhile, Shivajinagar in Pune city received 114 mm of rainfall in 24 hours ending at 8.30 am on Thursday, the third-highest in a single day in 66
