According to data, 25 inmates have died since February.

'Western Ghats in 6 States eco-sensitive'

Over 56k sqkm identified in draft notification

NEW DELHI

The Centre has issued a fifth draft notification to declare over 56,800 square kilometres of the Western Ghats across six States, including 13 villages in Kerala's landslide-hit Wayanad, Ecologically Sensitive Area (ESA), inviting suggestions and objections within 60 days. The notification was issued on July 31, a day after a series of landslides claimed over 300 lives in Wayanad district.


The draft notification proposes to declare 9,993.7 sq km in Kerala, including 13 villages in two talukas of the landslide-hit district, ecologically sensitive. Overall, the notification includes 449 sq km in Gujarat, 17,340 sq km in Maharashtra, 1,461 sq km in Goa, 20,668 sq km in Karnataka, 6,914 sq km in Tamil Nadu, and 9,993.7 sq km in Kerala in the proposed ESA.

Complete ban

The draft notification suggests a complete ban on mining, quarrying, and sand mining, with existing mines to be phased out within five years "from the date of issue of the final notification or on the expiry of the existing mining lease, whichever is

The BRS demanded a discussion on the subject, which the Speaker refused to entertain, again triggering protests from the Opposition benches, which saw BRS working president KT Rama Rao then leading his party MLAs in a walk-

They then staged a protest in front of the Telangana Martyrs' Memorial at Gun Park opposite the Assembly, but even there, the police swooped down on them, forcibly bringing the protest to a stop and packing them off in vehicles.

The Telangana State Legislative Assembly witnessed heated drama on Friday as Khairatabad MLA Danam Nagender used abusive language against BRS MLAs, causing an uproar.

With the entire opposition raising strong objections to his "unwarranted" and "offensive" remarks in the House, Speaker Gaddam Prasad Kumar intervened, and the MLA was forced to apologise by withdrawing his remarks.

During a short discussion on 'Activities for Sustainable Urban Development in Hyderabad Metro City' in the Assembly, Nagender, who defected from the BRS to the ruling Congress, was allowed to speak. The BRS legislators, led by party

NEW DELHI: National pistol coach Samaresh Jung was a bewildered man within hours of landing back in India from the Paris Olympics after discovering that the house he considered his home for nearly 75 years was an "illegal construction" and he had just 48 hours to vacate it. Jung, who was nicknamed 'goldfinger' after fetching an astonishing seven gold, five silver and two bronze medals in the 2006 and 2010 Commonwealth Games, said he needs at least two months to pack up and leave. "This was a property we were staying on for the last 75 years. In 1978, the land and structure was leased out to a Mr Singh and we have been paying rent to him since then," a hassled Jung said. PTI

SC rules out systemic breach in NEET-UG exam

The Supreme Court on Friday said it did not cancel the controversy-ridden NEET-UG 2024 examination amid concerns of paper leak because there was no systemic breach of its sanctity.

In its detailed reasons for the order which was pronounced on July 23, a Bench of Chief Justice DY Chandrachud and justices JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra said the National Testing Agency (NTA) must stop its flip-flop which was noticed this year as it does not serve the interest of students.

"We did not cancel the NEET-UG examination because there was no systemic breach of the sanctity of the exam beyond Hazaribagh and Patna," the Bench said. It issued a slew of directions and expanded the remit of the Centre-appointed panel

headed by former ISRO chief K Radhakrishnan to review the NTA's functioning and recommend exam reforms. The top court said since

the remit of the panel has been expanded, the committee would submit its report by September 30 on various measures to rectify deficiencies in the examination system. The Bench said the Radhakrishnan panel should consider framing standard operating procedure for adoption of technological advancements to strengthen the examination
