**SHEOPUR:** The only free-ranging cheetah in Madhya Pradesh's Kuno National Park has died, with officials suggesting drowning to be the primary cause of death. Wildlife activists, however, suspect poaching although there were no external injuries on the Namibian cheetah Pawan, found lying near the edge of a swollen nullah amid bushes. # SC grants bail to Kavitha; questions ED, CBI 'fairness'

### Apex court asks if agencies were free to 'pick and choose' anyone as accused

The Supreme Court on Tuesday granted bail to BRS MLC K Kavitha in the cases initiated by the Enforcement Directorate and the Central Bureau of Investigation in relation to alleged corruption in the implementation of the now-scrapped Delhi excise policy.

The court also questioned the central agencies over the fairness of their probe, asking if they were free to "pick and choose" an accused. The Bench, comprising Justice BR Gavai Justice Viswanathan, passed the order after noting that since 493 witnesses were to be examined and 50,000 pages of documents were to be considered in the two cases, there was no likelihood of the trial being concluded in the near future.

They ordered her release on bail, on furnishing bonds of Rs 10 lakh in each of the cases, while allowing her appeals against the July 1 verdict of the Delhi HC, which had denied her bail.

The two federal agencies also came in for some sharp criticism over the "fairness" of their investigation, with the apex court observing, "Sorry to see this state of affairs". "You will pick and choose anyone?" it asked

while referring to one of the witnesses whose statements were read out in the court during the arguments. "The prosecution has to be fair. You can't pick and choose anyone. What is this fairness? # Tummala abuses ryots over waiver

Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao abused farmers for questioning him over the government's failure over crop loan waiver and even tried to manhandle a farmer.

The incident occurred when a large number of farmers, activists of Left parties and Telangana Rashtra Rythu Sangham arrived at the district Collectorate to stage a protest seeking an unconditional crop loan waiver. The Minister, who was leaving the Collectorate after a meeting with the district Collector, was gheraoed by the farmers at the main gate.

As soon as the Minister got out of his car to speak with the protesting farmers, they started shouting slogans. Irked at the slogans, he refused to speak but was convinced by CPI leader B Hemanth Rao to give clarity over the crop loan waiver issue. The Minister, who spoke harshly with the CPI leader, also tried to grab an activist who continued shouting slogans and one of

the protestors questioned the Minister why he was abusing them. Later addressing the gathering, Nageswara Rao said crop loans up to Rs 2 lakh would be waived and any loan amount above that limit had to be cleared by the farmers to regularise the loan and to avail a fresh one.

Telangana Rashtra Rythu Sangham district general secretary Bhukya Veerabhadram said crop loans in the district were not waived completely. Loans of only 40 per cent of farmers were waived while loans of 60 per cent of farmers were yet to be waived. The government started

taking applications from farmers whose loans were not waived only after the farmer organisations started protesting but failed to clearly state that loans up to Rs 2 lakh would be waived. Instead, the government was asking farmers to clear the loan amount above Rs 2 lakh, he said warning that if the government failed to address the issue, serious protests would be staged across the

The fever survey conducted by the Directorate of Public Health (DPH) in Telangana during the ongoing season of viral fevers and vectorborne diseases raised several questions over the accuracy and reliability of the statistical data collected and presented to the general public by the Health Department.

The fever survey was conducted between July 23 and August 26, and the office of the DPH claimed that a total of 4.40 crore individuals in the State were covered, and 2,65,324 were identified with fevers.

# Doubts raised over accuracy 'Nabanna Abhijan' turns violent

## Several protestors, cops injured; over 200 people arrested

Large-scale violence on the streets of Kolkata and adjacent Howrah marred the cries for justice for the RG Kar hospital victim on Tuesday afternoon after protestors, aiming to reach the West Bengal State secretariat, Nabanna, fought pitched battles with the police at multiple stoppage

The violence, which lasted for nearly four hours, led to several injuries on both sides with senior police officers and women protestors among those who were hurt. More than 200 people were arrested from across the State, police said. Protestors took to the in-

cessant pelting of stones and glass bottles on the police at several spots where their progress was stopped. Fifteen personnel of the Kolkata Police and 14 from the State Police force were injured in the clashes, police said. Police resorted to large-scale lathi-charge, un-

ple converging points at Nabanna. BJP leader Suvendu Adhikari alleged that over 160 protestors, including 17 women, suffered injuries in the police action. The 'Nabanna Abhijan' call was given by an unregis-

Sarma was speaking in the Assembly on adjournment motions brought by the opposition parties to discuss the law and order situation in the State in the backdrop of the rape of a 14-year-old girl in Nagaon. Replying to the motion, he said the crime rate has not increased if the population growth is taken into account. When the opposition charged him of being partisan, Sarma retorted, "I will take sides. ### **DALIT BANDHU SCHEME** APPEARS ALL BUT SCRAPPED

**HYDERABAD:** The Dalit community in Telangana were witnessing a revolutionary social transformation since August 2021. That was when they found a companion in the State government when former Chief Minister K Chandrashekhar Rao launched the Dalit Bandhu scheme. However, exactly three years later, they are without that 'bandhu'. The Congress has apparently done all but announcing that the scheme has been scrapped. Those who were sanctioned second instalment by the BRS government last year, now are struggling to run their units after the Congress government froze all Dalit Bandhu accounts.
