Kejriwal to quit as CM, go for agnipariksha

Says will sit in CM chair after people give him honesty certificate

PTI NEW DELHI

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Sunday announced that he would resign after two days and sought early polls in the national capital while vowing not to sit in the CM's chair till people give him a "certificate of honesty".

The BJP hit back at the AAP supremo, terming his move a "PR exercise" and "drama". Kejriwal, released on bail from Tihar on Friday in the excise policy graft case, said he would hold a meeting of AAP MLAs in the next couple of days and a party leader would take over as Chief Minister.

The AAP national convener, who reached the party headquarters here on Sunday with his wife Sunita to address party workers, said he would become Chief Minister and Manish Sisodia Deputy CM "only when people say we are honest". Sisodia got bail in the excise policy case last month.

Following Kejriwal's unexpected announcement, the names of his wife Sunita and Delhi Ministers Atishi

and Gopal Rai as his probable replacement are doing the rounds. "I am going to resign after two days and ask people whether I am honest. Till they respond, I won't sit on CM's chair," he said. "Delhi elections are due in February but I de-

mand that the elections be held in November along with Maharashtra... I will only sit on CM's chair after people give me a certificate of honesty. Want to give 'agnipariksha' (trial by fire) after coming out of jail." Alleging the BJP tried to prove

him corrupt, Kejriwal claimed the saffron party could not provide good schools and free electricity to people because they were corrupt. "We are honest," he asserted. "They slap false cases against non-BJP Chief Ministers. If the CMs are arrested, I urge them not to resign but run their government from jail," the Delhi Chief Minister said. "I didn't resign (after arrest in excise policy case) because I respect democracy and the Constitution is supreme for me," Kejriwal said and asserted that it is only the AAP that can stand up to the BJP's "conspiracies"

Slamming Kejriwal over his resignation announcement, national spokesperson Shehzad Poonawalla said, "The AAP national convenor's announcement is a part of his plan to make his wife Sunita Kejriwal Chief Minister... Arvind Kejriwal has done a PhD on how to make a virtue out of necessity." He alleged that Kejriwal is enacting the resignation "drama" because the court did not acquit him in the (excise policy scam) case.

Kerala man died of Nipah, says Minister

MALAPPURAM

The 24-year-old man, who died recently at a private hospital in Malappuram, was infected with the Nipah virus, Kerala Health Minister Veena George

said on Sunday.

George said the suspicion of Nipah infection arose after a death investigation conducted by the Regional Medical Officer. "The available samples were immediately sent for testing and it turned out to be positive," the Minister said in a video message.

The Malappuram native, who reached the State from Bengaluru, died on September 9, after which his available samples were sent for testing to Kozhikode Medical college

hospital laboratory.

Malappuram health officials said the results from Kozhikode medical college indicated a positive result, after which a high-level meeting was held by the Health Minister on Saturday night itself and initiated the necessary steps as per the protocol.

Meanwhile, the results from the National Institute of Virology, Pune, on Sunday confirmed the infection. The Minister said 16 committees were formed on Saturday and a contact list of 151 people has been

KTR slams CM for halting Pharma City

Urges Revanth to provide clarity on govt's stand

BRS working president KT Rama Rao on Sunday expressed grave concerns over the future of the Hyderabad Pharma City project, urging Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy to provide clarity on the government's position.

The Pharma City project, touted as the world's largest integrated pharmaceutical cluster initiated under the previous BRS government, was seen as pivotal to cementing Telangana's position as a global leader in the life sciences and pharmaceutical sectors.

Telangana accounts for 40 per cent of India's pharmaceutical production and is home to over 1,000 life sciences companies, with a combined ecosystem valued at \$80 billion. The Pharma City was part of a broader strategy to enhance this sector, building on Hyderabad's reputation as the city with highest USFDA-approved pharmaceutical



Hyderabad Pharma City, with an investment potential of \$9.7 billion and the promise of over 5 lakh direct jobs, is integral to Telangana's growth. Scrapping this project without a clear alternative is deeply concerning

NDA govt for implementing ONOE during current tenure

NEW DELHI

The BJP-led NDA government will implement 'one nation, one election' within its current tenure, sources said, exuding confidence that the reform measure would receive support

across party lines. As the third term of the NDA government led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi completes 100 days in

office, the sources said the cohesion within the ruling alliance will continue for the rest of the tenure.

"Definitely, it will be implemented in this tenure itself. It will be a reality," one source said, speaking on condition of anonymity.

In his Independence Dav address last month, the Prime Minister made a strong pitch for 'one nation, one election', contending

that frequent polls were creating hurdles in the country's progress.
"The nation has to come

forward for 'one nation, one election'," Modi had said in his address from the ramparts of the Red Fort in the national capital.

He urged political parties "from the Red Fort and with the national tricolour as a witness to ensure the nation's progress". PTI

Valmiki scam hits close to home, investors in fix

the First Finance Credit Cooperative Society Limited's (FFCCSL) branch Mancherial and 12 other branches across the State are in a dilemma on how to withdraw their savings after a Special Investigation Team (SIT) arrested the firm's chairman and froze its accounts in connection with the multi-crore scam at the Karnataka Maharshi Valmiki Scheduled Tribes Development Corporation a

froze the customers' accounts as part of investigations into the Rs 89.62 crore transferred into the accounts of First Finance. Satyanarayana had estab-

lished First Finance with its

headquarters at Nallakunta in Hyderabad and administrative office at Chunnabattiwada in Mancherial town in 2019. Branches of the society were set up in Luxettipet, Manthani, Go-davarikhani, Peddapalli, Karimnagar, Jagtial, Sircilla, Siddipet, Husnabad, Vi-

jayawada and Tirupati of Andhra Pradesh. The branches reportedly have 10,000 customers. The soci ety raised various deposits worth Rs 12 crore. The investors are now

struggling to carry out transactions with regard to fixed and recurring deposits, following the arrest of the chairman. However, the society's recovery agents are collecting repayments of loans from the customers by giving manual receipts. The administrative office is now staffed by an attender with employees quitting the society due to

delay in salaries. "I deposited my savings at a branch of First Finance for my daughter's wedding. But now I am unable to withdraw the funds which are in a fixed deposit," an investor

Doctors to get unique IDs

NEW DELHI

The National Medical Commission (NMC) has initiated the process of registration of all MBBS doctors eligible to practise in recently launched portal, as a part of which all medical practitioners will have a unique ID.

The National Medical Register (NMR) is a dynamic database and will be a central repository of all registered doctors, in which their authenticity is verified by Aadhaar IDs. "The NMR is ready for registration of registered medical practitioners (RMPs) with immediate effect," Dr B Srinivas, Secretary of the NMC said.

All the MBBS doctors, who are registered on Indian Medical Register (IMR), have to register again on the NMR, the NMC said in a public notice recently.

Tempers flare over poor prep at Tank Bund for Ganesh immersion

Unhappy with the arrangements made for the immersion of Ganesh idols at Hussain Sagar, the Bhagyanagar Ganesh Utsav Committee members held a demonstration at Tank Bund against the State government machinery on Sunday.

They were angry over the failure of the administration in making arrangements, such as cranes and lights, for the smooth conduct of the idol immersion scheduled for Tuesday. The committee's office bearers criticised the State government for failing to live up to its promise of making full arrangements for the immersion of idols. "Instead of completing the arrangements as assured during the meetings, the au-

thorities put up banners announcing restrictions on immersion of idols on Tank Bund," they complained.

The committee members argued that the administration was trying to prevent the immersion of idols in Hussain Sagar and erected banners announcing the restrictions on a decades' old practice. "The authorities kept the organisers in the dark about their plans. Only

when people started complaining about the lack of facilities, we visited the spot and noticed that the works were not taken up," they lamented. In the afternoon, the

Ganesh Utsav Committee members removed the barricades, tore the banners put up along the Tank Bund stretch and started the idol immersion. They warned that they will make their own arrangements if the government was not interested in undertaking the works. The committee demanded that the administration should speed up the arrangements to be made for the immersion of idols. Towards the evening, the administration had started moving in heavy cranes on Tank Bund to facilitate the immersion.
