Sharp decline in India-China border standoff ends **State's GST collection**

Registers just 0.78% growth in Sept as against last year's 33%

STATE BUREAU HYDERABAD

In a worrying trend for Telangana's economy, the State's GST collections for September 2024 registered a meagre 0.78 per cent growth compared to the previous year - a stark contrast to the 33 per cent growth seen in September 2023 over its previous September 2022 numbers. This sharp decline raises concern over a broader slowdown in revenue growth.

Over the last three years, Telangana had enjoyed consistent double-digit growth in GST collections. In 2023, the State saw a 13 per cent increase in April, which surged to 33 per cent in September, showcasing a robust post-pandemic recovery. The trend continued throughout 2023, with overall growth rates maintaining a double-digit.

However, 2024 tells a dif-ferent story. While collections in April and May still showed a healthy 11 per cent increase, the momentum slowed significantly from June onwards. While the September 2023 collections soared to Rs 5,226 crore from Rs 3,915 crore in 2022 — a substantial 33 per cent leap — 2024 saw a near stagnation, with collections at Rs 5,267 crore, a mere Rs 41 crore increase from the corresponding period last year. Nations reach agreement on patrolling along LAC in eastern Ladakh

NEW DELHI

India on Monday announced it has reached an agreement with China on patrolling along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in eastern Ladakh, in a major breakthrough in ending the over four-year military standoff ahead of a likely meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping in Russia this week.

Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri said the agreement was finalised following negotiations by the two sides over the last several weeks and that it will lead to a resolution of the issues that had

External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said Indian and Chinese soldiers will be able to resume patrolling in the way they had been doing before the border face-off began and the disengagement process with China has been completed.

Prime Minister Modi and Chinese President Xi are

likely to hold a bilateral meeting on the sidelines of the BRICS summit in the Russian city of Kazan either on Tuesday or Wednesday. It is understood that the agreement will facilitate patrolling in Depsang and Demchok as there were

"Over the last several weeks, Indian and Chinese diplomatic and military negotiators have been in close contact with each other in a variety of forums," the Foreign Secretary said at a media briefing. "As a result of these discussions, agreement has been arrived at patrolling arrangements along the Line of Actual Control in the India-China border

Five naxalites were killed in an encounter with security forces in Maharashtra's Gadchiroli district on Monday, police said. The gunfight, in which commandos of the C-60 specialised combat unit of the Gadchiroli police played a leading role, took place in a forest in Bhamragadh taluka in the eastern Maharashtra district and comes just one month ahead of the State Assembly polls.

A press release issued by the office of the Gadchiroli

Superintendent of Police (SP) said in view of the November 20 elections, a group of naxalites had gathered in the forest on the Maharashtra-Chhattisgarh border for the last two days and
