KTR lashes out at the Congress govt for blatant crony capitalism and corruption

BRS working president KT Rama Rao on Tuesday demanded Prime Minister Narendra Modi to conduct a thorough investigation and take immediate action on the alleged Rs 8,888 crore AMRUT 2.0 tender scam in Telangana. He demanded a transparent investigation, citing the BJP's past claims about Telangana being a financial resource for Congress' electoral campaigns in other States.

"Prime Minister Modi speaks about Congress using Telangana as an ATM and R-R (Rahul-Revanth) tax being imposed in Telangana, causing rampant corruption. If his allegations are true, why is there silence on the AMRUT tenders scam? We gave all the necessary evidence for the Centre to act. This is a litmus test for the BJP's sincerity," he said.

Addressing a press conference in Delhi on Tuesday, Rama Rao lashed out at the Congress government for blatant crony capitalism and corruption. He cited tenders under AMRUT 2.0

35 dead as car rams into crowd in China

BEIJING/ZHUHAI

Thirty-five people were killed and 43 others injured when a 62-year-old man rammed his car into a crowd of people exercising at a sports centre on Monday in the Chinese city of Zhuhai, which is currently hosting the country's prestigious international air show.

Terming it a "major vicious incident", local police said the incident occurred around 7:48 pm on Monday when citizens were exercising at the sports centre where a large number of people gathered for physical workouts, the official media reported Tuesday.

The attacker, a divorced man identified as Fan, was quickly brought under control by the police as he was fleeing the scene, they said.

Responding officers found

Fan in his vehicle attempting to self-harm with a knife. They swiftly intervened and sent him to the hospital, it said. Fan is still receiving medical treatment as he was unconscious due to severe injuries to his neck and other areas and is not yet fit to be questioned by the police, state-run Xinhua news agency quoted the local po-

lice bureau as saying. Preliminary probe indicates that Fan's actions stemmed from his dissatisfaction with the property division outcome of his divorce, according to the

police. The police authori-ties have filed a case to investigate Fan on suspicion of endangering public safety by dangerous means and have placed him under criminal detention. (SEE PAGE 2)

Centre for 'zero-error' entrance tests

NEW DELHI

Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan on Tuesday announced that the Centre is introducing various reforms in the entrance examinations in the country beginning January and appealed to the State governments to extend their support for zero-error entrance tests. Pradhan said that the Radhakrishnan panel has submitted its report outlining reforms in the National Testing Agency (NTA) and to implement the recommendations, cooperation of

States is essential "I have appealed to all State government education secretaries. A new entrance exam series for the upcoming year will begin in January. Based on last year's experiences, the government has introduced numerous reforms," he said on the sidelines of a national work-

shop on higher and technical education attended by secretaries of states and union territories (UTs).

"The Radhakrishnan committee has submitted its recommendations and to implement it, the States' cooperation is essential. I have appealed to everyone on this matter, especially re-

garding entrance examinations. Bringing examinations, especially entrance exams, to zero error is the responsibility of both the Government of India and the State governments. We will work as a team to build confidence in the children of our country," the Education Minister added.

In the line of fire over alleged irregularities in the medical entrance examination NEET and PhD entrance NET, the Centre had in June set up the panel headed by former ISRO chief K Radhakrishnan to ensure transparent, smooth and fair conduct of examinations by the NTA. While NEET was under the scanner over several irregularities, including alleged leaks, UGC-NET was cancelled as the ministry received inputs that the integrity of the exam had been compromised. Both matters are being probed by the CBI.

Two other exams - CSIR-UGC NET and NEET PG were cancelled at the last moment as a pre-emptive step. The panel also includes former AIIMS Delhi director Randeep Guleria, Central University of Hyderabad Vice-Chancellor B J Rao and others. PTI

23-year-old Kashmiri woman found dead

HYDERABAD: A 23-year-old woman from Kashmir, who worked for a multinational bank, was found dead under suspicious circumstances at her apartment in the city. According to the police, the woman worked at the bank and stayed at a flat in an apartment building at Gulshannagar, under Filmnagar police station limits. The bank officials got nervous when she did not answer calls made to her mobile phone, following which the police were alerted. The police reached the apartment and on not getting an answer from the flat, they broke open the door of her flat. (SEE PAGE 2)

HYDERABAD: An advocate sustained a bleeding injury when two unknown persons attacked him with a knife while he was on a morning walk at Khairatabad IMAX Road on Tuesday. When he reached the KFC joint on the stretch, two persons came in the wrong route on a scooter and picked up an argument with him. One of the suspects took out a knife and attacked Kalyan, injuring his hand. The second person took away Kalyan's mobile phone and escaped, the Khairatabad police said.
