# BRS vows to stand by Dalit and tribal farmers

KTR says party will continue to fight against anti-people policies of Congress

STATE BUREAU HYDERABAD

BRS working president KT Rama Rao launched a blistering attack on the Congress government and Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy, pledging to stand by Dalit and tribal farmers facing forcible land acquisition and oppression.

He charged Revanth Reddy with betraying farmers and prioritising personal gains over public welfare. You had promised to help the farmers upon coming to power, but today, you are usurping their lands for the benefit of Adani, your sonin-law and brothers," he said. Addressing a massive Maha Dharna near the Tahsildar office at Ma-habubabad on Monday, he said the BRS would continue to fight against the anti-people policies of the Congress government.

He explained the injustice faced by tribal farmers in Lagacherla, the Chief Minister's own constituency. "Farmers there have been protesting for nine months against land acquisition, yet the Chief Minister had no time to meet them. Instead, he has flown to Delhi 28 times without addressing their concerns," he said.

Rama Rao said despite failing to deliver the prom-

ises in Telangana, Revanth Reddy shamelessly went to Maharashtra and made more false claims, but got kicked out. The BRS working president explained the struggles of farmers and tribal women, including a pregnant woman who took her grievances to Delhi and lodged complaints with the National Human Rights Commission, and National Commissions for SCs, STs

and Women. He lambasted the Congress for failing to fulfil promises such as Rythu Bandhu and 24-hour electricity and accused the government of exploiting farmers while serving corporate interests.

'Fortress of resistance' He questioned the silence of the police who arrested the BRS leaders for no fault of theirs but did not initiate

any action against Congress MLAs who threatened to pelt stones at him and other BRS leaders for holding the Maha Dharna.

Referring to the Telangana movement, Rama Rao invoked the historical significance of Mahabubabad, stating that 14 years ago, the place had ignited a fire that led to Telangana's forma-tion. "Today, it will be the fortress of resistance against those oppressing Dalits, BCs, and tribals," he declared. He warned of Statewide protests if the injustices continued, asserting that the BRS would hold similar dharnas across all 119 constituencies. "We are a force built by K Chandrashekhar Rao, unafraid and unyielding. This fight for justice will not stop until the people's rights are restored," he asserted.

# French firm pulls the plug on Adani

**TotalEnergies says no new** investment till charges lifted

NEW DELHI

French energy giant Total-Energies SE on Monday said it will make no new financial contribution as part of its investments in Adani Group companies till the Indian firm's founder is cleared of bribery charges.

The energy giant said it was not aware of the investigation into the alleged corruption. TotalEnergies is one of the biggest foreign investors in billionaire Gautam Adani's business empire and had previously taken stakes in the group's renewable energy venture Adani Green Energy Ltd (AEGL) and city gas unit Adani Total Gas Ltd (ATGL).

In a statement, the French firm said it learnt of US authorities indicting Gautam Adani and two other executives for allegedly paying \$265 million bribes to Indian officials to secure solar power supply contracts for AEGL. "This indictment does not target AGEL itself, nor any AGEL-related companies," TotalEnergies said. "Until such time when the accusations against the Adani Group individuals and their consequences have been clarified. Total-Energies will not make any new financial contribution

as part of its investments in the Adani Group of compa-

Adani Group has dismissed the allegations brought in the US court as baseless and has said it would seek all possible legal recourse. TotalEnergies holds a 19.75 per cent stake in Adani Green Energy Ltd-the renewable energy arm of the Indian group helmed by Gautam Adani. It also has a 50 per cent stake in three joint venture companies that produce electricity from sunlight and wind with AEGL.

The French firm also holds a 37.4 per cent stake in Adani Total Gas Ltd, which retails CNG to automobiles and pipes natural gas to households for cooking. "In accordance with its code of conduct, TotalEnergies rejects corruption in any form," the French giant said

## SC cancels land allocations to housing societies in GHMC

In a significant judgement, the Supreme Court on Monday cancelled the allocation of land to cooperative housing societies of various sections, including MPs, MLAs, All India Services officers, judges and journalists, within the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corpora-tion (GHMC) limits.

A Bench, led by Chief Jus-

tice Sanjiv Khanna, delivered the ruling, citing violations of the Constitution's principle of equality under

Article 14. The judgement was delivered in connection with an appeal filed by Keshav Rao Jadhav challenging government orders issued in 2005 and 2008 that allotted land at subsidised rates to various groups, including MPs, MLAs, All India Services officers, judges and journalists

by treating them as a separate class. The court quashed these orders, ruling that such classifications were arbitrary and discriminatory. The Bench also upheld a previous decision of the Andhra Pradesh High Court that had invalidated the allocations in cases filed in 2008. Further, the apex court stated that the interim directions passed by it in

some of these cases would now stand merged with the final direction where all parties involved would be accordingly bound by the same. While quashing the petitions filed by the defendants, the court declared the orders issuing allotment of the land were "bad in law" and violated Article 14 of the Constitution.

### Kavitha demands clarity on caste

BRS MLC K Kavitha trained her guns at the Congress and BJP over their failure to address the demands of BC community through caste census.
She charged both na-

tional parties with betraying the BC community and demanded that Congress leader Rahul Gandhi explain why the party, despite ruling the country for over 55 years, failed to conduct a caste census. She lambasted the BJP, stating that the party's policies have historically been anti-BC, SC, and ST, alleging that this bias is deeply embedded in its ideology. She recalled the BJP-led Central government's affidavit in the Supreme Court, where it categorically stated it would not conduct a caste census.

### Telangana puts Adani's Rs 100-cr donation on hold

Soon after Rahul Gandhi made it clear that the Congress wanted an investigation into all deals by the Adani Group, the party's government in Telangana wrote to the Adani Foundation seeking to stop the transfer of a donation of Rs 100 crore that the group had committed to the Young India Skills University here.

However, Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy denied any sort of pressure to cancel deals with Adani and claimed that his government only wanted to avoid controversies.

The letter, written by Special Chief Secretary Jayesh Ranjan to Adani Foundation chairperson Priti Adani, said the Chief Minister had given instructions not to seek transfer of

funds "in view of the present circumstances and arising controversies". However, it was not made clear whether it was a complete rejection of the donation or a temporary postponement of the fund transfer.

The Chief Minister, addressing a press conference here on Monday, claimed he was under no pressure to reject the donation and that he would not heed 'any sort of pressure'. He instead tried to blame opposition parties, accusing them of stirring a controversy over the Adani

Group's donation. The donation was to be accepted in the better interest of the State, especially to provide quality skills to the youth at the university, he claimed.
Interestingly, while LoP
Rahul Gandhi demanded a

thorough investigation into the alleged irregularities of the Adani Group, Revanth Reddy said the deals signed by the Telangana govern-ment "could not be cancelled unilaterally".

The same was informed to Rahul Gandhi as well, he said, adding that the government was not against investments by Adani, Ambani or Tata. Rahul Gandhi was against the out-of-the-way allotment of the Mumbai airport to the Adani Group by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Every company can file bids and bag contracts, which were being offered legally, he said. (SEE PAGE 2)

### Asifabad student hospitalised due to food poisoning dies

by Tuesday morning. They added that the funeral of the student would be held on the same day. Shailaja, along with four others, was initially admitted to a private

hospital of Mancherial when her medical condition deteriorated a few days back. She was then shifted to NIMS recently. She was one of the 63 students who fell sick after having dinner on October 30. Four students —
Kudimetha Jyothi, Maha
Laxmi, Bhumika and Lavanya — were already discharged from hospitals in Mancherial and Kagaznagar.

On November 14, the headmaster of the school, Srinivas, was suspended for dereliction of duties, leading to hospitalisation of the students on October 30

### Exotic snakes seized at RGIA
