Naidu flags falling birthrates

KUPPAM: Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu on Monday once again flagged the falling birthrates and said India should not repeat the mistakes committed by other countries such as South Korea and Japan, where birthrates have plummeted. Naidu said there should be a discussion in every home from tomorrow over hirthrate and population management. "We should not repeat the mistakes committed by other countries and be careful," he said.

ACB SUMMONS KTR AGAIN

HYDERABAD: The ACB has again summoned BRS working president KT Rama Rao to appear before it for questioning in connection with the Formula-E case on Thursday. The ACB officials went to the BRS working president's residence at Raidurgam on Monday and served the summons. Following its earlier summons, Rama Rao had reached the ACB office on Monday, but left without entering the office as his lawyer was refused permission to accompany him. Asserting his fundamental right to legal representa-tion, he said that he had in-

over being denied the company of his lawyer during the inquiry by the ACB and suspected the government might manipulate his statements similar to what happened with former MLA Patnam Narender Reddy. "I am a law-abiding citi-

zen. I am here, respecting the ACB and its notice issued to me. I will also ensure that I will give all the information that they want, but in the presence of my lawyer because they in the past created a situation where things which were not said by our leader have been said," he said. Couple dies after tiff Eight jawans among nine killed in Ch'garh IED blast

In their biggest strike on security forces in Chhattisgarh in two years, naxals blew up a vehicle using an improvised explosive device weighing 60 to 70kg, killing eight District Re-serve Guard (DRG) jawans and their civilian driver in Bijapur district on Monday, police said.

Police suspect the pow-erful IED was planted long back along the route used by DRG, a State police unit involved in anti-insurgency operations.

The explosive device went off near Ambeli village under the Kutru police station area at around 2.15 pm when DRG personnel from Dantewada district were returning in their Scorpio vehicle after an
