### **Rupee hits record** low of 86.70

**MUMBAI:** The rupee logged its steepest single-day fall in nearly two years and ended the session 66 paise down at its historic low of 86.70 against the US dollar on Monday, weighed down by a stronger American currency and surging crude oil prices. At the interbank foreign exchange, the rupee opened at 86.12, and moved 1 paisa during intraday to 86.11 before closing the session with a loss of a staggering 66 paise at its lowest-ever of 86.70 against dollar. **BUSINESS PAGE 8** 

### Kerala MLA Anvar resigns, backs UDF THIRUVANANTHA-

PURAM: Kerala legislator PV Anvar, who joined the Trinamool Congress (TMC) recently after parting ways with the ruling LDF a few months ago, resigned on Monday as the MLA of the Nilambur constituency. Anvar met Speaker AN Shamseer in his chamber at the Legislative Assembly complex here and handed over his resignation letter in the morning. Anvar had won the Nilambur seat as a CPI(M)led LDF supported MLA.

### 6.9 quake rattles southwest Japan

TOKYO: A strong earthquake with a preliminary magnitude of 6.9 hit southwestern Japan on Monday, triggering public warnings to stay away from coastal areas because of a tsunami advisory, which was later called off. There were no immediate reports of damage. Residents in some coastal areas were told to evacuate as a precautionary measure. One man was slightly injured in Kyushu after falling down some stairs Trains stopped running in Miyazaki Station, stranding passengers. A tsunami, estimated to be as high as 1 metre, reached land within 30 minutes of the earthquake. The waters detected at Miyazaki Port measured 20 centimetres high. AP

# **Right things will** happen at right time, says Modi

Hinting at restoration of statehood, PM says he'll keep his promise made to J&K people

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday asserted that he would keep promises he had made to the people of Jammu and Kashmir, a statement seen as an oblique reference to the demand for restoration of statehood voiced strongly by Chief Minister Omar Abdullah. "Yeh Modi hai, wada

karta hai toh nibhata hai. Har kaam ka ek samay hai, aur sahi samay pe sahi kaam bhi hone wale hai (This is Modi who keeps his promises. And right things are going to happen at the right time)," the Prime Minister said at a large public meet-ing where he shared the stage with Abdullah after inaugurating a strategic 6.4-km-tunnel between Srinagar with Sonamarg.

Terming Kashmir as India's crown, Modi also said the dream of 'Viksit Bharat' will be achieved only when this crown is bedecked with jewels. Speaking earlier at the function, Abdullah pressed for the restoration of statehood to Jammu and Kashmir as promised by the Prime Minister before the Assembly elections in September last year and said, "My heart be-

lieves that you will fulfil this promise soon." "You also promised (Assembly) elections within four months and you stayed true to your words," he said.

Without making a direct reference to the issue of statehood, Modi assured the gathering that all promises would be kept and the right things would happen at the right time. The Prime Minister said he wishes Jammu and Kashmir to be beautiful and prosperous. "There is an atmosphere of peace in Jammu and Kashmir and we have seen its effect on tourism. Kashmir is writing a new saga of development today," he said.

"Jammu and Kashmir of the 21st century is scripting a new chapter of development," he said and remarked that the region is regaining its identity as 'Paradise on Earth', leaving behind the difficult days of the past.

Modi said the Kashmir Valley will soon be connected by train and there is enthusiasm among people about it. He also paid tributes to the seven people who were killed in a terror attack near the tunnel here on October 20 last year.

After inaugurating the project, the prime minister went inside the tunnel and interacted with project officials.

# Cong govt eyes Rs 3,500 cr through land, flat auctions

Residential plots, unsold flats under Telangana Housing Board and Raiiv Swagruha Corporation to go under the hammer

The cash-strapped Congress government is set to raise over Rs 3,500 crore by auctioning residential plots and unsold flats under the Telangana Housing Board and Rajiv Swagruha Corporation across the State. A notification for these auctions is expected next month.

Nearly 1,400 open plots, ranging from 100-500 square yards, are located in wellplanned layouts at 41 locations, including Chandanagar, Gajularamaram, Kundanapally, Kurmalguda and Bahadurpally, in the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) area, Hyderabad Metropolitan Development Authority

(HMDA) area and various

other districts, including Karimnagar, Khammam, Gadwal and others. Additionally, 361 unfinished houses will be put up for sale. These follow earlier auctions where 3,444 plots and 195 houses were sold. Efforts are also under way to

sell around 700 unsold flats at the Rajiv Swagruha gated townships in Pocharam, Bandlaguda near Nagole, Jawaharnagar and Gajularamaram, among others. Many of these properties have remained unsold since the scheme's launch in 2007 in

erstwhile Andhra Pradesh, despite six previous auction phases.

The move comes amidst fiscal challenges, including poor revenue collections for the State during the current fiscal, compared to the last financial year. Telangana's revenue receipts stood at Rs 1.03 lakh crore by November this fiscal, compared to Rs 1.11 lakh crore during the same period last year.

While total receipts are around Rs 1.41 lakh crore against expenditure of Rs 1.38 lakh crore, Rs 2,621 crore was spent on loans and disbursements at November-end. As a result, the State faces a revenue deficit of Rs 14,288 crore and a fiscal deficit of Rs 37,850 crore. This auction aims to bridge the widening fiscal gap.

# India summons B'desh envoy on border fencing

NEW DELHI

India on Monday summoned Bangladesh's acting High Commissioner Nural Islam and conveyed to him that New Delhi has followed all laid down protocols in the construction of fencing along the border between the two countries.

India's action came a day after Indian High Commissioner to Bangladesh Pranay Verma was called in by the neighbouring country's Foreign Ministry to express its raeep con cern" over the "activities" of the BSF.

The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said it was conveyed to Islam that India observed all protocols and agreements between the two governments on the security measures at the border and it expects that all earlier understandings will be implemented by Bangladesh with a cooperative approach to combating crossborder crimes.

It said India reiterated its commitment to ensuring a crime-free border by addressing the challenges of cross-border criminal activities, smuggling, movement of criminals and trafficking. "Barbed wire fencing, border lighting, installation of technical devices and cattle fences are measures for securing the border. India conveyed its expectation that there will be a cooperative approach to combating cross-border crimes," it added. PTI

# Scarlet fever cases on the rise 1.5 crore take dip as Maha Kumbh begins

Hyderabad is witnessing a rise in cases of scarlet fever among children between five and 15 years, along with other viral fevers during the ongoing winter, senior paediatricians on Monday said.

Scarlet fever is a seasonal bacterial infection among children caused by group A Streptococcus, which can be treated through certain antibiotics. It usually takes at least two-five days for the symptoms to show up, once the child is exposed to the bacteria.

'We are seeing children in the five-15 age group with



scarlet fever for the past few days. If your child develops fever, red and painful tonsils with or without creamish deposits, a diffuse red sandpaper like rash on day 2

and/or a strawberry-like tongue, please consult a paediatrician," said Dr Sivaranjani Santosh, a developmental paediatrician from Hyderabad. (SEE PAGE 2) MAHAKUMBH NAGAR
