# Trump imposes stiff tariffs on Canada, Mexico, China

#### **North American allies announce retaliatory** tariffs on US imports as trade war erupts

WASHINGTON

President Donald Trump on Saturday signed an order to impose stiff tariffs on imports from Mexico, Canada and China, drawing swift retaliation and an undeniable sense of betrayal from the country's North American neighbours as a trade war erupted among the longtime

The Republican President posted on social media that the tariffs were necessary "to protect Americans," pressing the three nations to do more to curb the manufacture and export of illicit fentanyl and for Canada and Mexico to reduce illegal immigration into the US.

The tariffs, if sustained, could cause inflation to significantly worsen, threatening the trust that many voters placed in Trump to lower the prices of groceries, gasoline, housing, autos and other goods as he promised. They also risked throwing the global economy and Trump's political mandate into turmoil just two weeks into his second term. Trump declared an economic emergency in

Trump's order includes a mechanism to escalate the rates charged by the US against retaliation by the other countries, raising the specter of an even more severe economic disruption.

"The actions taken today by the White House split us apart instead of bringing us together," Canadian Prime

Minister Justin Trudeau said in a sombre tone as he announced that his country would put matching 25 per cent tariffs on up to \$155 billion in US imports, including alcohol and fruit. He channelled the betrayal that many Canadians are feeling, reminding Americans that Canadian troops fought them alongside Afghanistan and helped respond to myriad crises from wildfires in California to Hurricane Katrina. 

# Farmers hit as tomato prices crash

Tomato farmers are facing a major crisis in Telangana as they are hardly getting Rs 5 per kg, and in some places, a shocking Rs 2.5 per kg for their crop, one of the most essential ingredients in the menu in almost every home.

After spending so much time and money on the crop for the last two to three months, the farmers were not even getting the labour wages spent on harvesting them. While the vegetable is being sold at Rs 10 a kg to Rs 15 a kg in the retail market, farmers are getting just Rs 5 per kg. In Siddipet, some farmers even abandoned

their crop after some traders offered them just Rs 2.5 a kg! Farmers in erstwhile

Medak district cultivated the crop in about 2,000 acres but the slump in prices for the last two months has pushed them into a serious crisis. It has once again exposed a lack of guidance from the Horticulture Department on how to cultivate the crop and to what extent, apart from exposing the lack of support from the State government.

Farmer Vadithya Lachiram Nayak from Shivvampet mandal came all the way carrying a couple of quintals of tomato to the Sangareddy Sunday market hoping to

get a good price. However, he could hardly get Rs 15 per kg. Nayak said he had to sell the vegetables at Rs 10 per kg by evening since he could not take them back.

He had sold the rest of the harvest to traders at Rs 5 kg at his farm. Since there were no cold storage or processing units in the erstwhile Medak district, tomato farmers are now in deep financial trouble.

Another farmer, Ravi Goud, who was in the news for setting his crop on fire a month ago, said the Horticulture Department must guide them on when to cultivate the crop and when they should not.

## Secret codes to arrest SSC question papers leakage

Having learnt the lesson the hard way, the Education Department initiated robust measures to prevent Class X exams question paper leak this year.

For the first time, unique secret security codes will be printed on the question papers of the SSC Public Exams commencing March 21. If a question paper is leaked, photographed or photocopied and posted on the messaging applications and social media platforms, the security code will aid in tracing the source besides identifying the centre and hall from which the paper has been leaked. The unique code will be printed on all

question papers. "This measure is aimed at preventing question paper leak. If the question paper is leaked, the individuals behind the leak can be caught within no time," said a senior official.

In 2023, two back to back incidents of SSC exams question paper leakage triggered a massive uproar, forcing officials to suspend invigilators and centre su-

perintendents. In the first case, within a few minutes of the commencement of the first Class X exam, an invigilator at an exam centre in Tandur allegedly photographed the first language question paper (Telugu) and circulated it in WhatsApp. Following day, the second language Hindi question paper was leaked

on WhatsApp.
This time, around 5.1 lakh students registered for the exams, which will be conducted from March 21 to April 4. Meanwhile, commencing this academic year, in place of the existing multiple answer sheets system, the department introduced a single 24-page answer booklet for all the Class X
