Ukraine death toll reaches 18

Kyiv: The death toll from a Russian missile strike in the central Ukrainian city of Kryvyi Rih has risen to 18, including nine children, regional Governor Serhii Lysak said Saturday. A further 72 people were injured in Friday's attack the youngest a 3-monthold. About half of them remained in the hospital, with 17 in serious condition. "There can never be forgiveness for this," said Oleksandr Vilkul, head of the city's defense council condemning the strikes.

UoH "relocation move" stirs a hornet's nest

University already an eco-park, say students

The reported proposal of state government to relocate the University of Hyderabad (UoH) campus, which over the past half-acentury has painstakingly built itself as an Institute of Eminence, is met with staunch opposition from various quarters.

As per reports in a section of media, the state govern-ment is reported to be toying with the idea of shifting the UoH to the proposed Future City and develop the present campus, where angry protests has disrupted the government plan to auction 400 acres of adjoining Kancha Gachibowli land for commercial exploitation, as an eco-park.

This purported move has drawn wide spread condemnation with the university community stating that if that happened, they would be gearing up for another round of protest that would be much more stronger than last week's agitation that halted the deforestation of Kancha Gachibowli land.

Present and former students of the university condemned the plan, stating that it was vengeance against students' recent ve-

union president Umesh Ambedkar accused the government of diverting attention from the main issue. "When students are fighting over the university's original land of 2,300 acres, how

can the government come up with a proposal to shift the campus itself? For the last 50 years, several crore rupees were spent on building the university. Any move to shift the campus will meet with much stronger protest from the university community," he said. UoH Students union general secretary Nihad Sulaiman found the government's plan to be absurd. "The university is already an eco-park. We will



Congress misses deadline on key schemes

The Congress government has missed yet another deadline leaving many applicants anxious. On January 26, the government launched four schemes -Rythu Bharosa, Indiramma Housing scheme, Indi-ramma Atmeeya Bharosa and distribution of new ration cards, with much fanfare, but so far, only one scheme has been implemented, that too partially.

Save for the partial implementation Bharosa, the other three schemes, Indiramma Housing, Indiramma Atmeeya Bharosa and new ration cards are yet to be implemented.

Pet schemes Indiramma Indlu. Indiramma Atmeeya Bharosa, new ration cards yet to take off full fledged

On January 25, before the formal launch of the schemes, Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka said that the schemes would be formally launched in only one village in every mandal for implementation on saturation mode. This was in sharp contrast to its earlier announcement that the schemes – distribution of ration cards, Indiramma Indlu, Rythu Bharosa and

Indiramma Atmeeya would be Bharosa launched State-wide for all beneficiaries on R-Day.

Briefing the media, the Deputy Chief Minister had said all the applications received at gram sabhas would be compiled and scrutinised and eligible persons would be extended benefits under the different schemes. He also said this would be completed by March. Civil Supplies Minister N Uttam Kumar Reddy too had assured that in the identified village, the exercise for distribution of ration cards, Indiramma Indlu, Rythu Bharosa and Indiramma Atmeeya Bharosa would be completed on saturation mode.

Decline in Hyderabad's office space leasing: KTR

Reacting to the alarming decline in office space absorption in Hyderabad, BRS working president KT Rama Rao has voiced concern and wanted the State government to take immediate corrective measures to address the issue.

Hyderabad witnessed a sharp 41% decline in office space absorption during Q1-2025, as highlighted in a recent Colliers report. In a strongly worded statement, he said: "This isn't a nationwide trend.'

Before planning new IT parks, the Telangana Chief Minister must address the decline in office space ab-

"Hyderabad stands out in its downward spiral," he

added, lamenting the city's fall from its once-dominant position as a leader in office space absorption.

Rama Rao called for introspection and a reassessment of policies, urging the government to form a dedicated committee and engage with key stakeholders to understand the reasons behind the market's dwindling confidence.

Taking a jab at the current approach, he remarked, "Bulldozers don't bring jobs! Policies do!"

He stressed the importance of strategic planning and sustainable development to restore Hyderabad's position as a preferred destination corporate investments.

India, Sri Lanka ink defence pact

Signalling an upswing in their strategic ties nearly four decades after the IPKF episode, India and Sri Lanka on Saturday inked a defence pact to institutionalise military cooperation with Prime Minister Narendra Modi asserting that security of both the nations is interlinked and dependent on each other.

Following talks between PM Modi and Sri Lankan President Anura Kumara Dissanayake, the two sides firmed up a total of seven pacts, including one on developing Trincomalee as an energy hub under a trilateral framework, also involving the United Arab Emirates and another agreement on power grid connectivity.

While Modi reaffirmed that New Delhi will always stand with the people of the island nation, Dissanayake said Sri Lanka will not allow

its territory to be used in any manner inimical to security interests of India as well as

In the meeting, the Prime Minister pitched for resolving the vexed fishermen issue between the two countries with a "humane approach" and hoped that Colombo will fulfil the aspi-

rations of the Tamil people and conduct provincial council elections.

In his media statement, Modi said India converted loans worth more than USD 100 million into grants in the last six months alone to help Sri Lanka and announced reducing interest rates for loans given to the island na-

tion. Apart from the seven pacts, India also firmed up a debt restructuring agreement as part of its economic assistance for Colombo with Modi saying it will facilitate immediate assistance and relief to the people of Sri Lanka.

Modi also announced a support package of approximately 2.4 billion Sri Lankan rupees for social and economic development of the Eastern provinces of Sri Lanka

In reflection of the importance Colombo has attached to Modi's visit, the PM was accorded a ceremonial welcome at the historic Independence Square and was conferred Sri Lanka's highest civilian honour, the Mithra Vibhushana.

Though the Modi-Dissanayake talks produced over 10 concrete outcomes, the defence cooperation pact emerged as the center-
