Report highlights targeting of opposition parties BRS and BJP

Highhandedness by the police, torture of villagers and political vendetta by targeting of opposition parties BRS and BJP have been highlighted by the Investigation Division team of the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) that did a spot inquiry into the violence at Lagacherla on November 11, 2024, following the Congress government's attempt to forcibly acquire land for a proposed Pharma Village.

According to the report submitted by the team, villagers who were arrested at night were beaten up at the Parigi police station and were also threatened not to speak about the beating in front of the magistrate. Despite scattered spells of thunderstorms, Telangana, including Hyderabad, are experiencing intense heatwave-like conditions with temperatures consistently hovering between 41 de-grees Celsius and 44 degrees Celsius.

More than 50 locations in at least 15 to 20 districts of the State have experienced severe heat with average maximum temperatures hovering between 43 degrees Celsius and 43.7 degrees Celsius. The intense heat that interspersed the
