NEW DELHI: A court here on Friday issued notices to Congress **Parliamentary Party** chairperson Sonia Gandhi and Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi in the alleged National Herald money laundering case. The Rouse Avenue Courts asked the Gandhis and others accused to show cause as to why cognisance should not be taken on the charge sheet filed by the ED under the PMLA. Drugs worth Rs 547 cr seized

NEW DELHI: Drugs worth Rs 547 crore were seized by the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) and 15 people arrested in this connection, the Union home ministry said on Friday. "Bharat is axing down drug cartels with ruthless aggression. The Amritsar Zonal Unit of the NCB axed a drug diversion cartel through a four-month operation across four States, seizing drugs worth Rs 547 crore and arresting 15," Union Home Minister Amit Shah's office wrote on X. It said this action is a giant stride towards building a drug-free India under the vision of Prime Minister Narendra

NEW DELHI: In a major development, the Agency (NIA) conducted extensive searches across Punjab in connection with a terror conspiracy involving Babbar Khalsa International operatives. The raids targeted premises linked to gangster Harpreet Singh alias Happy Passian, a close associate of Pakistan-based Khalistani terrorist Harwinder Singh alias Rinda. A total of 17 locations were searched across Gurdaspur, Batala, Ferozepur, Fazilka, Tarn Taran, Amritsar, and Faridkot. The operation led to recovery of incriminating materials. IANS

India map again **Shares incorrect map in video promoting TG** govt's efforts in conducting caste survey STATE BUREAU HYDERABAD

The Telangana Congress has once again courted controversy by sharing an incorrect map of Indiabarely a week after a similar error during the Bharat

The latest incident occurred on the party's official X account, where a 2.07minute promotional video on the caste census showcased an inaccurate depiction of the country's map.

The video was intended to highlight the Revanth Reddy-led State government's efforts in conducting a caste-based survey and portray Telangana as a model for other States.

This is not the first time the party has come under fire for such a lapse. Earlier, Munugode MLA Komatireddy Rajgopal Reddy had shared a video on his X account featuring a similar incorrect map — omitting

India for freeze on Pak funds

India will be asking global multilateral agencies, including the IMF, to have a relook at funds and loans provided to Pakistan, as New Delhi seeks to corner the neighbouring State diplomatically following the dastardly terror attack in Pahalgam last month which killed 26 tourists.

"We will be asking all multilateral agencies to review the loans and support to Pakistan," a government source said.

The IMF Executive Board is scheduled to meet Pakistan officials on May 9 for first review of the extended funding facility, and request for an arrangement under the resilience and sustainability facility.

The IMF Board will evaluate fresh \$1.3 billion arrangement for Pakistan under its climate resilience Ioan programme also assess an ongoing \$7 billion bailout package.

As of December 31, 2024, the Asian Development Bank (ADB) has committed 764 public sector loans, grants, and technical assistance totalling \$43.4 billion to Pakistan. ADB's current sovereign portfolio in Pakistan includes 53 loans and three grants worth \$9.13 billion.

ADB committed a \$320-million loan for the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Rural Roads Development Project to upgrade around 900 km of flood-suscep-

tible rural roads in the province. In January 2025, the World Bank approved \$20 billion lending package for Pakistan for the cash-strapped country to overcome its challenges. PTI

Amaravati will transform

Pak to keep Wagah border open for its citizens to return

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan on Friday announced that it would continue to allow the use of the Wagah border crossing for its citizens stranded in India, following New Delhi's decision to revoke visas in the aftermath of the Pahalgam terror incident.

The Attari-Wagah border, located near Amritsar in India and Lahore in Pakistan, was shut on Thursday after being kept open till April 30. As many as 70 Pakistani nationals were reportedly stranded at the border on Thursday, as the deadline for leaving India expired a day earlier. Responding to media queries, the spokesperson for Pakistan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MoFA) acknowledged reports of Pake istani nationals, including children, stranded at the Attari border on the Indian side. Bilawal says Pak suffered as it has a past with extremists

LONDON/ISLAMABAD: Pakistan has a past with extremist groups and suffered because of this, Pakistan Peoples Party chief Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari said while answering a question on Islamabad backing terror outfits. Bhutto-Zardari was asked in an interview whether he agreed with Defence Minister Khwaja Asif's controversial remark last week. Questioned if Pakistan has been supporting, training and funding terrorists, the Minister had then said his country did the West's "dirty work" for decades. Answering the question if he agreed with Asif's claim, Bhutto-Zardari said, "I don't think that it's a secret that Pakistan has a past as far as extremist groups are concerned. And as a result of this, we have suffered. Pakistan has suffered. We've gone through waves of extremism." PTI

India against terrorists: Vance

NEW YORK: Vice President JD Vance has said the US hopes that India will respond to the Pahalgam terrorist attack in a way that does not lead to a "broader regional conflict" and expects Pakistan to "cooperate" with New Delhi to "hunt down" militants sometimes operating from their soil.

Vance made these remarks on Thursday in an interview with Fox News.

"Our hope here is that India responds to this terrorist attack in a way that doesn't lead to a broader regional conflict," he said.

After being asked, "You worried about India and Pakistan?" "Well, sure, I'm worried about any time you see a hotspot breaking out, especially between two nuclear powers," Vance said. "We've obviously been in close con-

tact with our friends in

India and Pakistan. Our hope here is that India responds to this terrorist attack in a way that does not lead to a broader regional

conflict," he said. "And we hope, frankly, that Pakistan, to the extent that they're responsible, cooperates with India to make sure that the terrorists sometimes operating in their territory are hunted down and dealt with," he added, PTI

The Congress government's flagship Indiramma housing scheme is facing widespread criticism over serious lapses in implementation. From flawed beneficiary selection to changes in eligibility norms and delays in fund disbursement, the programme is plagued by mounting complaints.

Initially, the government promised 3,500 houses in each of the 119 Assembly constituencies. However, under Phase I, the scheme was restricted to just one village per mandal.

During the Praja Palana application drive, nearly 80 lakh applications were received — 23.25 lakh from urban areas and 57.25 lakh from rural regions.

Shockingly, over 53 per cent of applicants were declared ineligible. Of the 80
