JEE Advanced results today

HYDERABAD: The Joint Entrance Examination (JEE) Advanced 2025 results will be declared on Monday. The Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Kanpur, which organised the test, is expected to release the results on the official website <https://jeeadv.ac.in/> around 10 am. After the results are announced, the Joint Seat Allocation Authority (JoSAA) counselling for admissions into IITs, NITs and other institutions will begin on June 3.

Pvt banks to hike credit card fee

NEW DELHI: Starting July 1, private sector banks such as HDFC and ICICI, will increase charges on various credit card and banking services. HDFC has announced new charges for credit card users, especially for transactions involving online gaming, digital wallets, and utility payments. If a customer spends over Rs 10,000 in a month on online skill-based gaming platforms, 1% fee will be charged on the total monthly spend in the category. ^{IANs}

Guj Minister's son held for 'scam'

DAHOD: Gujarat Minister Bachubhai Khabad's son Balvant Khabad was arrested on Sunday, days after being granted bail in another case connected to the MGNREGA works, police said. Balvant along with his brother Kiran, sons of the Gujarat minister of state for panchayat and agriculture, were released on bail on May 29 in the first FIR against them in April. While Kiran was arrested the same day in another case, Balvant was arrested on Sunday. ^{PTI}

Terror, extortion module busted

CHANDIGARH: The Punjab Police on Sunday claimed to have dismantled a terror and extortion module linked to an operative of Pakistan's ISI-backed Babbar Khalsa International (BKI) with the arrest of two men. Director General of Police Gaurav Yadav said BKI member Jeevan Fauji was orchestrating an extortion racket, targeting individuals in Punjab's border districts. Two of his associates have been apprehended, he said. ^{PTI}

Hyd woman cheated by Pak husband returns home

A Hyderabad woman, who was stranded in the Gulf after being cheated by her Pakistani husband, has returned home. Earlier, her life revolved around a mobile number, which was the only way to reach her husband in Abu Dhabi, but was switched off thus leaving her clueless and hapless.

The 22-year-old woman, hailing from Domalguda in Hyderabad, had lost her parents, and reached the UAE on a visit visa and worked in a supermarket in Abu Dhabi. There, she was befriended by a 30-year-old Pakistani

man. He allegedly lured her the promising her a regular visa and also proposed to her, according to her. They got married and the marriage was solemnized by an Abu Dhabi court.

After a few months, her husband sent her to Hyderabad after she conceived to see her family and to return

soon on a regular visa. However, he went incommunicado after that, while the recent Indo-Pak border tensions further compounded her concerns for the future of the upcoming child. She alleges that her husband blocked her number and then blocked the dialling code as well for Indian numbers, making it impossible for her to reach him.

However, after several efforts, she finally managed to communicate with him and he asked her to reach Qatar. Believing in him, she reached Doha only to find that he had again gone incommunicado. ^(SEE PAGE 2)

In a visit that has been strangely been kept a secret, the State government recently got Advisor to the Andhra Pradesh government and veteran irrigation engineering expert Kanniah Naidu to visit the Sunkishala site in Nalgonda to help the Hyderabad Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board (HMWSSB) get the project back on track after the August 2024 retaining wall collapse, which caused major embarrassment for the Congress government.

Naidu not only visited the site, but has suggested to HMWSSB officials that they

redesign the three gates proposed for the three intake tunnels as part of the intake well of Sunkishala. Naidu's visit to the Sunkishala site,

about 180 km from the city, had a HMWSSB team, led by Managing Director K Ashok Reddy, accompanying the irrigation engineering expert.

Hasina indicted for mass murder

DHAKA

Bangladesh's International Crimes Tribunal on Sunday indicted former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and two others on several charges, including mass murder, for their alleged role in the violent crackdown on student-led protests last year.

Sunday's proceedings marked the start of Hasina's trial in absentia nearly 10 months after the ouster of her government following the protests. "We do hereby take into cognizance the charges," the three-judge



ICT Bench said after a prosecution team formally accused them of attempting to tame the protests using brutal force.

The tribunal simultaneously issued a fresh arrest warrant against Hasina and then home minister Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal. The third accused, the then inspector general of police Chowdhury Abdullah Al-Mamun, is in custody to stand trial in person.

The prosecution charged Hasina with exercising absolute authority to ruthlessly suppress the uprising. ^{PTI}

AP sits on huge dues to BRAOU

Ten years of waiting, and still there is no sign of reimbursement of nearly Rs 600 crore by the Andhra Pradesh government to Telangana's Dr BR Ambedkar Open University (BRAOU). The university, listed in the 10th schedule of the AP Reorganisation Act 2014, has ren-

dered its education services to around AP students, besides maintaining 72 study centres, paying pensions and salaries of the staff working in the university study centres there.

As per the 10th schedule of the Act, the university was to serve both Telangana and Andhra Pradesh for 10 years, or till 2024. For this, both the governments had to

enter into an agreement for extending services, besides initiating the process for the university's bifurcation.

Post the bifurcation of erstwhile Andhra Pradesh, since both the States did not enter into an agreement, there was an issue regarding services and salaries of the employees working in the AP study centres.
