#### **India's extreme** poverty rate drops

NEW DELHI: India's extreme poverty rate declined sharply to 5.3% over a decade from 27.1% in 2011-12, even as the World Bank revised upwards its threshold poverty line to \$3 per day. Given India's inflation rate between 2017 and 2021, a revised extreme poverty line of \$3 would constitute a 15% higher threshold than \$2.15 expressed in 2021 and result in a 5.3% the World Bank said in a NATION PAGE 8

# Kaleshwaram lifeline of TG: Harish

THE SENIOR BRS MLA VOWS TO **EXPOSE CONGRESS PARTY'S** 'FALSE PROPAGANDA'

Defending the decision to shift the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project from Tummidihatti to gadda, BRS leader and senior MLA T Harish Rao on Saturday asserted that the move was driven by technical and hydrological necessities, not political motives.

Making a powerpoint presentation on the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation project here, he declared his readiness to appear before the Justice Pinaki Chandra Ghose panel and present facts to counter what he described as a "Congress' misinformation campaign" on the project. Harish Rao questioned

Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy's claims that the BRS fears the Commission's probe, asking, "Who told the CM that we are afraid of the Kaleshwaram inquiry?"

He vowed to expose the Congress party's "false propaganda" and provide a clear account of the project's achievements.

Earlier, detailing the reasons behind the shift from Tummidihatti to Medigadda, he recounted the challenges faced by the BRS government after Telangana's formation on June 2, 2014. He had led a team of engineers to Maharashtra to

**'THUMMALA ALSO BACKED MEDIGADDA'** 

HYDERABAD: Reiterating that the construction of the Medigadda barrage as part of the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Scheme could not be attributed singularly to any individual or entity, BRS leader T Harish Rao on Saturday recalled that even the present Agriculture Minister Thummala Nageshwar Rao was also a signatory to the decision-making process in favour of it. In a compelling powerpoint presentation at Telangana Bhavan, the former Irrigation Minister highlighted that Nageswara Rao was a key member of a three-member Cabinet sub-committee formed during the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) government to oversee the redesign and reengineering process involving the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Scheme. This sub-committee played a crucial role in shaping the project, including the decision to relocate the main barrage from Tummidi Hatti to

> a Central Government PSU, recommended shifting the project to Medigadda, where water availability was considerably higher at 1,651 TMC compared to Tum-midihatti's limited capacity.

The Medigadda site enabled the construction of three barrages - Medi-Annaram gadda, and Sundilla — storing 38 TMC of water in the Godavari river, and irrigating drought-prone areas.

### 'Congress-BJP trying to malign project'

Launching a scathing attack on the Congress-BJP nexus in the State, Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) working president KT Rama Rao on Saturday accused both the national parties of orches-trating a campaign to tarnish the reputation of the Kaleshwaram Project, a critical irrigation lifeline for Telangana's farmers.

Speaking at a presentation titled "Kaleshwaram Project: Countering False Propaganda with Facts," delivered by former Minister and MLA T Harish Rao, he defended the transformative initiative spearheaded by former Chief Minister K Chandrashekhar Rao.

Highlighting Chandrashekhar Rao's vision for the rebuilding of the State, he credited him with har-nessing the Godavari River's waters to bolster Telangana's agriculture. "KCR, a true visionary, ended decades of farmers' struggles by ensuring water security," he said, noting that projects like Palamuru-Ranga Reddy and Sitarama neared 90 per cent comple-

tion during the BRS rule, paving the way for a prosperous, fertile State.

However, for the past 18 months, the Congress-BJP alliance was waging a relentless smear campaign, distorting facts to mislead the public about the project, he said, accusing the Congress-led government of undermining Telangana's core aspirations - water, funds, and jobs - through

misrule, corrupt practices.

Congress had colluded with contractors and diverted funds to its leaders in Delhi, while leveling baseless charges against BRS, he said, also questioning the silence of Congress and BJP leaders on unauthorised projects in AP, contrasting this with their aggressive scrutiny of State's decadelong developmental gains.

He also criticised the National Dam Safety Authority for its selective focus, ignoring major failures elsewhere, such as Gujarat's Morbi bridge collapse, which killed 140 people, recurring bridge failures in Bihar, SLBC tunnel disaster that claimed eight lives, and flooding at Vattem pump

#### IAF to hold massive combat drill near border

India has issued a Notice

to Airmen (NOTAM) for a major Indian Air Force (IAF) exercise scheduled to take place near the southern sector of the India-Pakistan International Border in Rajasthan from Saturday, June 7, to Sunday, June 8. The exercise is part of the IAF's regular operational preparedness and will be conducted in airspace near the border. According to the NOTAM, the aerial drill will commence at 3:30 p.m. on June 7 and conclude at 9:30 p.m. the following day. During this period, airspace over the designated region will be restricted to ensure the safe and seamless execution of air operations.

The combat exercises will feature a range of advanced air assets, including frontline fighter jets such as Rafale, Mirage 2000, and Sukhoi-30, in addition to surveillance platforms. and other support systems. IANS

### **Five Naxalites** gunned down

Five Naxalites were killed in two encounters with security forces in an ongoing operation in the Indravati National Park area of Chhattisgarh's Bijapur district, police said on Satur-

With the latest casualties, seven Naxalites, including top leaders Sudhakar and Bhaskar, were neutralised in the operation in the last three days, they said. "Security forces have recovered the bodies of seven Maoists during the ongoing anti-Naxal operations in the Indravati National Park area of the district," a senior police official said.

On Saturday, two bodies were recovered following a gunfight, while three were found after the exchange of fire on the intervening night of Friday and Saturday, he said. The official said the

operation involving personnel from the state police's Special Task Force (STF) and District Reserve Guard (DRG) as well as the CRPF's specialised unit CoBRA, was launched on June 4 based on input about the presence of Maoist leader Sudhakar, Telangana State Committee member Bandi Prakash, Dandakaranya Special Zonal Committee (DKSZC) member Pappa

## Six food testing labs to be set up in Hyderabad

With the task force teams of Telangana Commissioner of Food Safety noticing unhygienic practices in several kitchens of city restaurants, the Health Department has decided to set up new food testing labs in Hyderabad.

The department proposed six new food testing laboratories with one each in six Hyderabad zones - LB Charminar, Nagar, Khairtabad, Secunderabad, Serilingampally, and Kukat-

This decision comes following a series of inspec-



The new labs will be located to cover both urban and adjoining semi-urban areas with high density of restaurants.

tions by food safety officials that revealed deplorable conditions in the kitchens of several restaurants besides

adulterated food being served under the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) limits. joining semi-urban areas with a high density of restaurants. The new labs are aimed at ensuring food served by the restaurants to its patrons

The six labs will be located

to cover both urban and ad-

meet quality and safety standards. Each laboratory will be equipped with modern testing equipment to detect contaminants, adulteration, and overall food hygiene. The department proposed Rs.15 crore for setting up each lab, bringing the total expenditure to Rs.90 crore.

"During our raids, we have come across some extremely unhygienic prac-

tices in some restaurants, including preserving mutton and chicken for about one month from date of packaging, use of synthetic colours and expired spices. Some restaurants were found to preserve finely grounded leafy vegetables without use before or expiry date. Whenever we come across such things, we immediately discard them," a Health Department official said.

As per NRAI's India Food Services Report 2024, there are a staggering 74,807 restaurants in both organised and unorganised food services sectors across Hyderabad.
