Reaffirms faith in judiciary

In a major breakthrough for Indian and African agriculture, scientists at the International Crops Research Institute for the Semi-Arid Tropics (ICRISAT) have developed ICPV 25444, the world's first pigeonpea cultivar capable of withstanding extreme summer heat and maturing in just 125 days, compared to the tradi-

tional six-month cycle. The heat-tolerant, photo and thermo-insensitive variety has been successfully tested in Karnataka, Odisha, and Telangana, recording yields of up to 2 tonnes per hectare. Importantly, this development allows pigeonpea cultivation beyond the traditional kharif season, including during peak summer when temperatures can reach 45°C.

Showcasing the crop during a field visit to the ICRISAT campus on Monday, Director General Dr Himanshu Pathak hailed the development as a landmark in climate-resilient agriculture. "This is a shining example of what science can achieve when driven by urgency and purpose. Our scientists have delivered a solution to address pulse shortages and climate challenges," he said. In a detailed and evidencebacked deposition before the Justice PC Ghose Commission on Monday, Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) leader and former Irrigation Minister T Harish Rao strongly defended the decision to relocate the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project's water intake point from Tummidi Hatti to Medigadda.

Rao attributed the shift to three critical factors: Maharashtra's unrelenting opposition, environmental constraints, and the critical issue of water availability, which rendered the original site unfeasible. His submission, supported by extensive documentation, aimed to counter allegations of mismanagement and political motives levelled by the Congress government.

Rao elaborated that Maharashtra's refusal to approve the required 152-metre Full Reservoir Level (FRL) at Tummidi Hatti, restricting it to 148 metres, severely limited water availability, making the site 00

TGSRTC hikes bus pass fares

In a major blow to the middle class and students, the Telangana State Road Transport Corporation (TGSRTC) on Monday hiked bus pass fare by nearly 20 per cent. TGSRTC has increased the prices of both general and student bus passes, with the new

rates effective from June 9. The fare for the Ordinary bus pass has been increased from Rs 1,150 to Rs 1,400. The Metro Express bus pass price has been hiked from Rs 1,300 to Rs 1,600, and the Metro Deluxe pass from Rs 1,450 to Rs 1,800.

The State Road Transport Corporation has also increased the fares of the Greater Hyderabad and Green Metro AC passes.

RTC officials have claimed the increase in the operational costs, increase in the demand and expenditure, apart from the 'Mahalakshmi' free travel for women scheme among other factors for the increase.

"For the past three years, there was no increase in the bus pass fares. But now, we are forced to come up with the decision for the betterment of the RTC. Due to the increase in the demand for bus services and expenditure which included procurement of new buses, paying timely salaries, loans and also the long pending DAs," said a senior RTC official.

Though the State government has been supporting to some extend financially, the certain steps are utmost needed for the survival of RTC, he added.
