Axiom-4 eyes June 19 lift-off NEW DELHI: The muchdelayed Axiom-4 commercial mission to the International Space Station, carrying Indian astronaut Shubhanshu Shukla and three others, is now targeting a launch on June 19, ISRO announced on Saturday. The Axiom Space mission was to blast-off from NASA's Kennedy Space Centre in Florida on June 11, but had to be delayed first due to a fuel leak in SpaceX's Falcon-9 rocket and then due to a leak in the Russian section of the ISS. The astronauts were originally scheduled for lift-off on May 29. PTI

PM to go on **3-nation tour**

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi will undertake a three-nation tour starting Sunday, during which he will take part in the G7 Summit in Canada, and visit Cyprus and Croatia to shore up India's bilateral cooperation with these two countries. "This will be the first-ever visit by an Indian Prime Minister to Croatia, marking an important milestone in the bilateral relationship," the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) announced on Saturday. Modi will first visit Cyprus on June 15-16 at the invitation of the country's President. PTI

Accusing the Congress government in Telangana and BJP leaders from the State of compromising Telangana's interests by maintaining a "stoic silence" on Andhra Pradesh's Rs 80,000-crore Godavari-Banakacherla link project, BRS leader and former Irrigation Minister T Harish Rao on Saturday warned that the project could result in large-scale water diversion — similar to what occurred via the Pothireddypadu head regulator in the Krishna basin posing serious risks to Telangana's irrigation and water security.

Addressing a press conference with a detailed PowerPoint presentation, Rao said the project lacks statutory approvals from the Godavari River Management Board (GRMB), the Central Water Commission (CWC), and the Apex Council. He claimed that Andhra Pradesh's plan involves diverting 200 TMC of Godavari water in the first phase, with a proposed expansion to 400 TMC. The project includes a massive offline reservoir at Bollapalli with a gross storage capacity of 150 TMC — three times the size of Telangana's Mallanna Sagar, the largest reservoir under the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation

Ahmedabad crash toll 270, high-level probe panel set up

NEW DELHI/AHMEDABAD

The Centre on Saturday set up a high-level multi-disciplinary panel to ascertain the "root cause" of the crash of the London-bound Air India plane in Ahmedabad and assess any contributing factors including mechanical failure, human error and regulatory compliances even as the death toll in the disaster rose to 270.

As the panel headed by Union Home Secretary Govind Mohan was mandated to give its report in three months, Civil Aviation Minister K Rammohan Naidu said aviation regulator DGCA has ordered "extended surveillance" for the Tata-owned airline's Boeing Dreamliner series 787 planes. The Civil Aviation Ministry said the committee will not be a substitute to other probes being conducted by relevant organisations.

In a post on X, Air India said it has done one-time safety checks on nine of its Boeing 787 Dreamliners and is on track to complete the checks on the remaining 24 such planes as directed by the Directorate General of Civil Aviation(DGCA).The carrier now has 26 Boeing
