DELHI-BOUND AI DREAMLINER RETURNS TO HK AFTER SNAG

MUMBAI: A Delhi-bound Air India Boeing 787-8 Dreamliner from Hong Kong returned to its airport of origin on Monday within an hour of takeoff after the pilot in command suspected a technical issue. The flight, Al 315, landed safely in Hong Kong and all passengers have disembarked from the plane, the airline said in a statement, adding that the aircraft is under going inspection. The flight departed from Hong Kong at 12.16 pm (local time) and was scheduled to land in Delhi at 12.20 pm IST. The flight had departed after a delay of almost 3.5 hours as its scheduled departure was at 8.50 am, as per the flight tracking website flightradar24.com. "Al315 operating from Hong Kong to Delhi on 16 June 2025 returned to Hong Kong shortly after takeoff due to a technical issue. The flight landed safely at Hong Kong and is undergoing checks. PTI

'Bomb threat' on Hyd Lufthansa flight

and was scheduled to land at the Hyderabad airport in the early hours of Monday, but Lufthansa said it had to be turned around over a bomb threat, with passengers provided overnight accommodation. "Out of an abundance of caution, Lufthansa flight LH752 from Frankfurt to Hyderabad returned to its point of departure after authorities were made aware of a bomb threat posted on social media," Lufthansa said in a statement.

"The safety of our passengers and crew is Lufthansa's highest priority. Affected passengers were provided with accommodation in Frankfurt and will be continuing their journey to Hyderabad today (Monday)," the statement said. Airport sources in Hyder-

abad had said that a "bomb threat email targeting Lufthansa flight LH752 was received at the Hyderabad airport at 18:01 hrs on June 15, 2025". They said a bomb threat assessment committee was formed and all procedures were followed. In the interest of safety, the airline was advised to divert back to the origin or the nearest airport. Iran plans to exit nuclear treaty

Amid intensifying hostilities with Israel, Iran on Monday announced that its Parliament is drafting legislation to withdraw from the Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT) of Nuclear Weapons, raising global concerns about the future of nuclear stability in the region.

The proposed move was announced alongside a statement from Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian, who reiterated Tehran's stance that it has no plans to develop nuclear

that Iran's nuclear activities remain focused on peaceful energy and research, aligning with Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei's long-standing religious edict against weapons of mass destruction. "The Islamic Republic of

Iran remains opposed to the development of nuclear arms, but it will pursue its legitimate right to nuclear energy and research under international law," Pezeshkian said. The NPT, a international landmark treaty that came into force

in 1970, seeks to prevent the spread of nuclear weapons, promote peaceful uses of nuclear energy, and facilitate nuclear disarmament. Iran's potential exit from the treaty would mark a significant escalation, further deepening global fears of a nuclear arms race in the Middle East. This follows three consecutive days of heavy missile exchanges between Israel and Iran, with no sign of a ceasefire. On Monday, Israel urged civilians living near weapons

Infant among 3 shot dead at Utah festival

WEST VALLEY CITY (US)

Three people, including an eight-month-old infant, were fatally shot at a Utah carnival after two groups got into an argument, police said. Police officers working at WestFest at Centennial Park in West Valley City saw the two groups Sunday

"As they approached to break up the altercation, a 16-year-old male from one of the groups pulled out a gun and fired," the depart-

ment posted on X. One officer fired back but did not hit anyone. In addition to the infant, a 41-year-old woman described as a bystander was killed, police said. An 18-year-old man in one of the groups also was struck by gunshots and died.

Two other teens, a 17year-old female and a 15year-old male, were both hit in the arm, police said. It was not clear if they were connected to the groups involved. Their conditions were not known. AP

Poll announcement: TPCC chief angry with Ponguleti Minister make such a state-

TPCC president Mahesh Kumar Goud expressed displeasure over Revenue Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy's announcement regarding the schedule for the upcoming local body elections. The Minister had on Sunday stated that the notification for the local body polls would be issued by the end of this month. However, this remark did not go down

well with the TPCC president. "The local body elections are tied to the implementation of 42 per cent reservations for BCs. Ministers must exercise caution when commenting on matters currently before the courts," Goud said in a statement issued on Monday.

He further pointed out that the issue of conducting local body elections was to be deliberated in the Cabinet before any official announcement. "How can a

ment to the media without Cabinet discussion?" he asked. "A Minister should not interfere in matters that come under the purview of other Ministers, nor should they make announcements related to another's portfolio. Such actions could trigger unnecessary rifts within the party," Goud cautioned. also advising Ministers to refrain from making public statements without party's consent.
