JAMMU: An Air India Express flight from Delhi to Srinagar via Jammu returned to its origin airport before landing here on Monday afternoon. The flight returned to Delhi as a precautionary step following a "GPS interference" and an alternative aircraft was later provided to the passengers to reach their destination. The officials said that the flight IX-2564 was supposed to land in Jammu around noon before leaving for Srinagar, but it hovered over the Jammu airport for some time before its pilot decided to return to Delhi without landing. Iran strikes US bases in Qatar, Iraq

Qatar intercepts missiles, says no casualties reported, airspace now safe

DUBAI

Iran launched missile attacks Monday on US military bases in Qatar and Iraq, retaliating for the American bombing of its nuclear sites and escalating tensions in the volatile region.

Qatar condemned the attack on Al Udeid Air Base attack. but said it successfully intercepted the missiles and no casualties were reported. It said its airspace was now safe. Iran said the attack in Qatar matched the number of bombs dropped by the United States on its nuclear sites this weekend, signalling its likely desire to de-escalate. Iran also said it targeted the base because it was outside of populated areas.

wrote on the social platform X: "We neither initiated the var nor seeking it. But we will not leave invasion to the great Iran without answer." Earlier in the day, Israel expanded its war against Iran to include targets associated with the country's struggling theocracy, striking the gate of a Tehran prison notorious for holding political activists and hitting the headquarters of the military force that suppressed recent protests. As plumes of thick smoke rose over Tehran, Israel was attacked with yet another barrage of Iranian missiles and drones. The persistent fire has become a reality for civilians in both countries since Israel started the war to target Tehran's rapidly advancing nuclear programme. On the 11th day of the conflict, Israel said it attacked "regime targets and government repression bodies in the heart of Tehran,' but Israeli officials insisted they did not seek the overthrow of Iran's government. The Israeli military warned Iranians that it would continue to attack military sites around Tehran over "the coming days". AP

AAP wins big in Punjab, Guj bypolls


Cong-led UDF wrests Nilambur; TMC, BJP bag one each

NEW DELHI AAP's Gopal Italia on Monday won from Gujarat's Visavadar assembly constituency and his party also retained Punjab's Ludhiana West seat while the Congress-led UDF wrested Nilambur from the ruling LDF in Kerala, according to results of Assembly bypolls in four states.

Iran announced the attack on state television as martial music played. A caption on screen called it "a mighty and successful response" to "America's aggression." The Ain al-Assad base housing US troops in western Iraq was also targeted, an Iraqi security official who was not authorised to comment publicly said. It wasn't immediately clear if there was damage to the Iraq base or any injuries.

Qatar's Foreign Ministry said the attack by Iran's Revolutionary Guards was "a flagrant violation of Qatar's sovereignty, its airspace, and international law." Al Udeid is also home to the Combined Air Operations Center, which provides command and control of air power across the region as well as the 379th Air Expeditionary Wing, the largest expeditionary wing in the world.

The retaliation came a day after the US launched a surprise attack Sunday morning on three of Iran's nuclear sites. Just before the explosions, Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian NEW DELHI: Oil prices rose to their highest level since January this year on Monday after the US strikes on nuclear facilities in Iran, with the country threatening to shut Strait of Hormuz, through ch around 20 per cent of global crude supply flows. Brent crude futures was up \$1.92 or 2.49 per cent at \$78.93 a barrel early on Mon-day. US West Texas Intermediate crude increased \$1.89 or 2.56 per cent to \$75.73. Brent crude prices surged as much as 5 per cent.

SAUDI, RUSSIA OFFER OIL CONTINUITY

NEW DELHI: For India, which reportedly holds crude reserves for 90 days, Saudi Arabia's ability to reroute crude exports via the Red Sea offers a layer of supply continuity amid the Strait of Hormuz uncertainty, accord ing to a report. While India sources 18-20% of its crude from Saudi, the Petroline Yanbu corridor ensures that a significant portion of these volumes could still reach Indian refiners even if Hormuz is disrupted. "India's import mix provides a strong cush-ion, Russian inflows (2.2 million barrels per day) now ex-ceed combined Middle East supplies," report says. IANS
